W. C. RICE WIDELY KNOWN RESIDENT TO LAST REWARD

William Crews Rice, well known and highly respected citizen of Medford for the past 29 years all of which time he has been connected with the Jackson County bank where he had made hosts of friends, passed away at 10:50 Saturday, February 9, 1929, at the age of 56 years, 11 months and 29 days.

Mr. Rice was born in the state of Kentucky, February 19, 1872. Thirty-one years ago in that state he was united in marriage at Edenville and for the benefit of Mrs. Rice's health they moved ten years later to Colorado where they resided for a few months before coming to this city.

Mr. Rice was faithful and true in his line of endeavor, having been cashier of two different banks in Kentucky and will be greatly missed at his post of duty in the local bank.

He had been in failing health for the last six weeks, but gave up his occupation but two weeks before his demise. When his condition became so serious, Dr. Sellling of Portland was summoned for consultation, but arrived a short while before his passing.

He leaves besides his wife, Maudie S. Rice, one son, William C. Jr., also two brothers, J. T. Rice of Kentucky and M. K. of Texas, and one sister, Mrs. W. E. Whittington of Indiana.
