BARNES PREDICTS 1000 ACRES FOR SWEET CHERRIES

That there will be 1000 acres of sweet cherries set out in the Rogue River valley within the next three years, was an announcement made this morning by J. C. Barnes, local realtor and nurseryman, who has recently returned from the Dalles, Salem and Hood River, where he has spent some time comparing these districts with Medford as to the possibilities of cherry production. Mr. Barnes claims that the same factors in regard to climate, soil and irrigation, which makes Rogue River valley a superior late pear district, makes it a superior sweet cherry district. Sunshine in the spring and summer, with practically no rain at picking time, rich deep well drained soil and irrigation with no below zero temperature in the winter, combine to make this valley and its slopes ideal for sweet cherries, according to Mr. Barnes. Cherry trees grow much faster than do pear trees, and the local nurseryman, who claimed that the Dalles valley, which he declares cannot surpass Medford as a cherry center, he found five year old trees producing 100 pounds of cherries to the bush. "Bing cherries, packed and shipped east in cartons last net the growers from 12 to 15 cents per pound," he said. "One car of bing cherries, presented and prepared by a process to kill all fungus germs, kept until Christmas and sold at that time in London for \$1.00 per pound." Mr. Barnes said that 500 acres in bing cherries here would mean that our packing houses could get busy one month sooner than they do and so would reduce the overhead that is now charged in pear growers. "Five hundred acres in Royal Ann cherries would mean that the canneries could start a month sooner than they do," he said. "It would mean much larger canneries—in fact it would mean the im-
