TEXT BOOKS CHANGE BILL PASSES SENATE

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 21.—After a one-sided debate Senator Fisher's bill providing for text-book changes every ten years passed the senate Wednesday. Bailey of Lake, Elliot and Miller voted against it. The measure would supplant the present law whereby one-third of the books are changed every two years. The education committee reported the measure out without recommendation.

Some argument preceded the vote on a bill fostered by the Republican state central committee of political parties to fill vacancies in party tickets occurring after primary elections. All members were persuaded to support the measure and no negative votes were heard.

SPEED INCREASE PLAN NIPPED IN COMMITTEE

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 21.—(By A) proposal to increase the speed limit on Oregon highways from 35 to 40 miles per hour, was stepped on by the house committees on roads and highways and automobiles and roads, at a joint meeting. A tie vote was cast and Chairman Wesslow cast his vote in favor of leaving the limit at 35 miles.
