

SALVATION ARMY LEADERS ARRIVE FOR CONFERENCE

Brigadier and Mrs. Albert E. Boynton, divisional commanders of the Salvation Army for Oregon and southern Idaho with headquarters in Portland, will be in Medford today to conduct a conference for young people for southern Oregon.

Over 100 young people and officers will be in Medford for the three-day conference beginning Friday evening at 7:30 with a reception to the delegates. The general public is invited to this reception.

On Saturday four sessions will be held, beginning at 9:30 a. m. The evening will be devoted to a demonstration given by the delegates and the public is invited to attend this also.

On Sunday two sessions will be held in the morning and in the evening. Brigadier Boynton will conduct a public service.

The Salvation Army conducts 14 different departments for children and young people, according to needs and opportunities in various cities. Many of these departments are for children and young people not necessarily belonging to the Salvation Army. Under privileged young people, unable to secure memberships in groups requiring larger fees are provided for in these various departments.

These groups cover generally a four-fold purpose of culture, mental, spiritual, physical and service, endeavoring to cultivate a character not one-sided.

MR.-MRS. PARTRIDGE OF HUNGARY ARRIVE IN VALLEY TO MAKE HOME

Forty-eight Hungarian partridges, received by Kenneth Murray, local sportsman and employee of the MacFarlane company, from the state game farm at Pendleton, arrived from the north yesterday and were released, under the supervision of Ed Lamport, in the valley.

The young birds arrived in splendid shape and apparently took kindly to their new habitat, according to Mr. Murray. There is no open season on these game birds here, and they are carefully protected by the commission. The state has been releasing the Hungarian birds in southern Oregon for the past several years, and when a sufficient number has accumulated an open season will be fixed.

Last spring Mr. Murray purchased a large number of Bob Whites from Mexico and released them in the valley. These also, reported doing nicely here, and are protected by the state.

NOW WE KNOW AGE OF WARNER

Thirty years ago Medford and Ashland were greatly excited over a serious accident to one of Medford's foremost roughneck kids, who eventually recovered and later became base drummer of the town band and otherwise qualified to become a postmaster of Medford.

Meager details of this accident are contained in the following item published Wednesday by the Ashland Tidings in its "Thirty Years Ago" news item department:

"Willie Warner, aged 15 years, son of L. L. Warner of Medford, was thrown from a horse Tuesday morning and dangerously injured. When found he was unconscious, in which condition he remained for some time. His recovery is reported as doubtful."

This republication in the Ashland Tidings also clears a long standing local mystery as to just how old Medford's postmaster is, and may also account for his favorite summer diversion of asking information of local people about points of interest in the city.

GRIEVE MONKEY WILL ADD TO TAX BURDEN ASSESSOR ASSERTS

Deputy assessors will take to the field a week from tomorrow, with instructions to place an assessed valuation upon dogs, foxes, fowls, and the South American monkey now held in captivity by James E. Crane of Prospect, as a tourist attraction, and a great deal of peanuts. Cans cut will not be assessed this year, Assessor Coleman said.

Assessor Coleman said he would trust his deputy to appraise the monkey at its full value. He said the monkey would not be exempt because it was the only monkey in the county. The simian is a yearling, and has started innumerable arguments upon the Darwin theory in the Prospect area.

The assessor estimates there are 2,600 dogs in the county, and figures 500 of this number are orphans, as nobody will admit ownership. Some of the mountain ranches have as high as 14 dogs about the place. The rancher will confess ownership to one, and aver that the remaining 13 are neighbor dogs, who have come over to visit his dog. The assessor has also learned that a first-class dog will crawl under the house when he sees its deputy assessor coming.

Sailor Jack Wood will be the official referee of the evening.
