Shell and Grantham are charged with attempted robbery at the Music Box radio shop, where Shell is accused of hitting the bill while Grantham took the proprietor toward the rear of the shop. King and Tremaine are alleged to have been connected with bootlegging in Medford for sometime and are accused of the possession of a 50-gallon still, copper tubing and 15 gallons of alleged moonshine.
