

ASHLAND TALKERS NOSE OUT LOCALS BY SINGLE-POINT

Medford was nosed out of the southern Oregon district debating championship by single point, as a result of last night's triangular contest, held between the high school teams of Medford, Ashland and Grants Pass.

The three schools entered the contest last night with Ashland standing 7, Medford 5, and Grants Pass 3. The Medford negative, consisting of Elbow Mac Wilson and George Wines, won a 2 to 0 decision over Grants Pass.

The winner of this debate will then meet other district winners to decide the championship for the state. Grants Pass won a 2 to 1 decision over Ashland in Ashland, giving the former city three points in all.

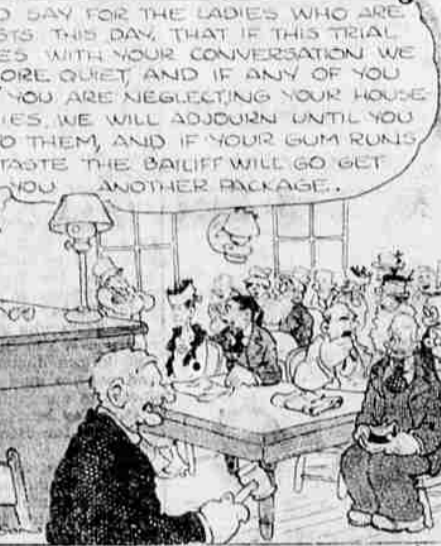
Blmer Bieble has purchased a coupe from the Chascomb Ford agency.
