MEDFORD SCRIBES BACK ART SCHOENI FOR EDITOR'S JOB

Student body politics at the University of Oregon are just beginning to warm up in relation to the election of an editor for The Oregon Daily Emerald, the campus newspaper, for next year. In this annual political turmoil Arthur Schoeni of Medford, who has been active on the Emerald staff ever since he began his course at the university several years ago, will be conspicuous as a candidate. The warming up process started with the recent announcement that Joe Pigney, a Portland student, who writes sports from Eugene for the Portland Journal, will serve as associate editor of the Emerald for the remainder of the year. Pigney is an able sports editor of the Emerald, and rumor has it that he aspires to succeed Arden X. Pangborn to the editorship. Friends of Schoeni "small news" and are on guard, as they feel that the associate editor job may be an asset in seeking the editorship.

It is a cliché, it is pointed out in university circles, that if Pigney runs for editor he will have strong opposition in Schoeni, who is managing editor of the Emerald, and it is customary for managing editors to run for the position as editor, which is probably the most powerful student job on the campus. Anyhow, run or no run, win or lose, Arthur Schoeni will have the solid backing of the newspaper fraternity of Medford as well as the best wishes of the general populace of the city, for his vacations for years have been spent in local newspaper work. Steps are quickly under way for the Medford Newspaper Reporters' Union to raise an immense fund to back Art's campaign for editor of the Emerald. Contributions for this fund may be paid over to any local newspaper person, or may be left under either end of the Bear Creek bridge, from where they will be gathered occasionally, and if anything is left after paying the expenses of administering the local fund it will be cheerfully forwarded to Mr. Schoeni.

Furthermore, his local fellow newspaper workers, after much effort, have hit upon the splendid slogan for his campaign, "Art for Art's Sake," and this slogan will be given free of charge to the Schoeni faction at the university.
