

GIRL HITCH HIKER SERIOUSLY HURT, FOUND ON HIWAY

GRANTS PASS, Ore., March 4.—(AP)—Margaret Morse, 18, was in a hospital here today after having been found late yesterday in a serious condition on the Redwood highway about 40 miles south of Grants Pass. The girl had left her home in Washington on a "hitch-hiking" trip to the south-land.

Police here said a man whose identity they did not know, was being held in jail in Crescent City, Calif., in connection with the case. Sheriffs of Josephine county, Oregon, and Del Norte county, California, were making an investigation.

The girl said she was picked up by two men and taken into California and then returned to Oregon.

When questioned here the girl said she was subject to epileptic attacks. She felt one of these coming on, she said, and asked to be let out of the automobile. Police here said, however, that they expect to make at least two arrests.

The girl was found by a tourist and taken to the hospital here.

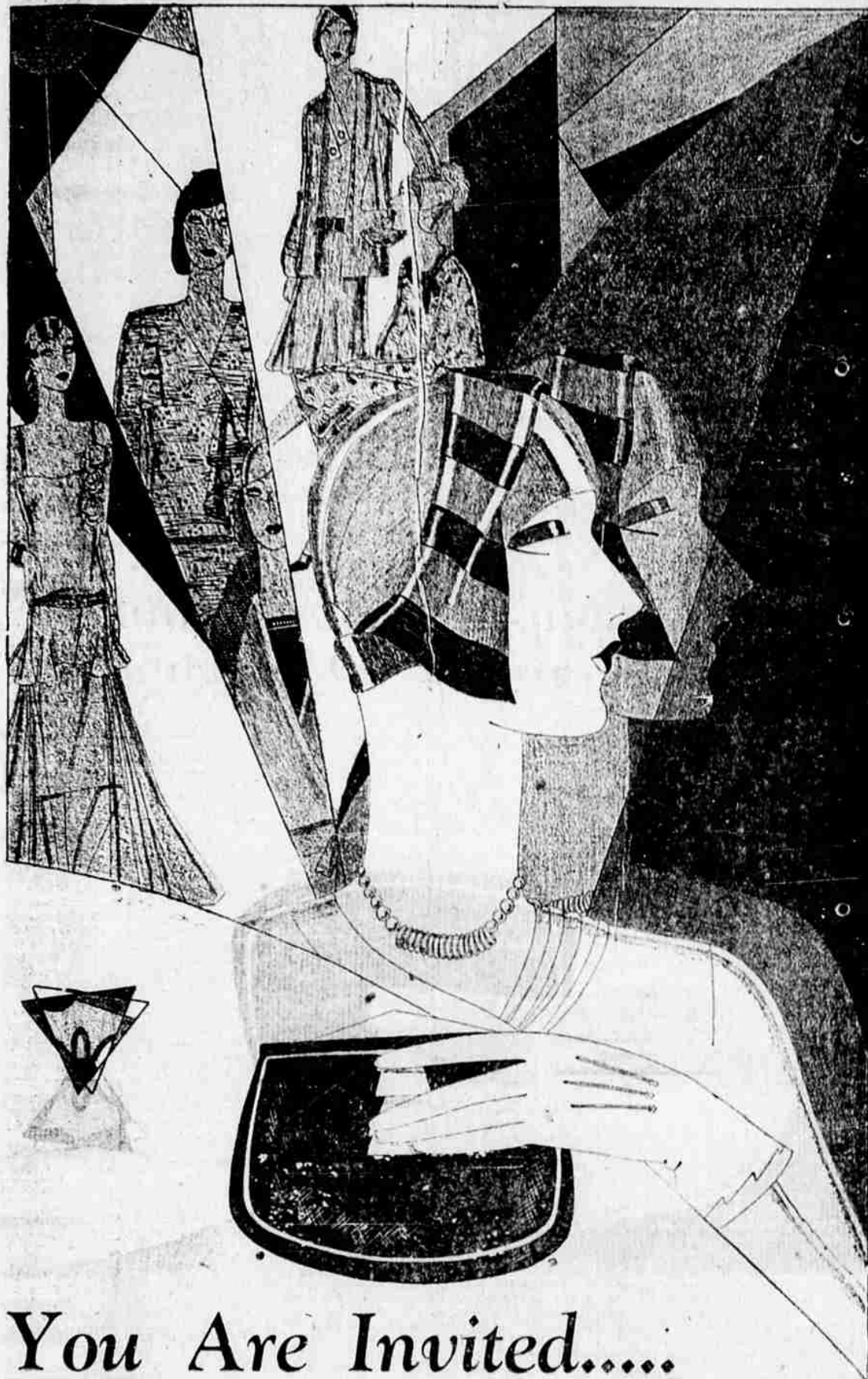
Galluses Disliked
