## PHILLIES HOPE TO LEAVE JINX DURING SEASON

Consistency of Cellar Position Irks Fans—Early Prospects Encouraging—Pitching Talent Is Unknown Quantity.

WINTER HAVEN, Fla., March 8.—(AP)—Supporters of the Philadelphia Nationals hope and believe that they have lost the jewel of consistency since the last season ended. The Phillies have consistently finished last in the National league race of late and any change must be for the better.

Early signs at the training camp indicate that Burt Shotton, now a sophomore manager, at least has a chance to push his team out of the cellar.

A large question mark remains in the pitchers' names but the rest of the lineup has been improved that even if the pitching is no better than it was in 1928 it will show more results.

Manager Shotton is able to offer a good infield, fair outfield and two excellent catchers. He finds his stock on the shelves for emergency call low but may be able to do something in the way of replacements later.

The most encouraging development for Phillie fans is in the infield. Tommy Thoenig seems certain to play great ball at shortstop. The star of the 1928 world series, when he wore a St. Louis Cardinal uniform, has recovered from a broken leg, suffered in 1927, and runs without the slightest suggestion of a limp.

Francis Thompson at second base is an established star. Artie Whitney third, and Don Hurst first, are well on the road that leads to baseball glory even with a tail-end team. The 1928 season marked the first year in last company for Whitney and Hurst and their manager believes that the experience gained under fire will show dividends this year. Whitney hit .309 in his first chance and Thompson and Hurst were not far away.

## BASEBALL SEASON CONTEST TONIGHT FOR MEDFORD TO MARK'S FAREWELL BE DECIDED SOON FOR MANY STARS

Bend and Eugene have wired Court Hall asking the Medford baseball team to join with them in forming a league consisting of cities of Eugene, Bend, Klamath Falls and Medford. Such a league, it is believed, would insure the fans good semi-professional ball, and also increase the attendance. Expenses would be greater on account of the long jump, of two hundred miles between both Eugene and Bend, or about six hours each way by auto. As to distance Medford is geographically better situated than any of the other towns.

Medford was never better fortified than this year to put a first class ball team in the field, according to Mr. Hall. With Cliff Best to do the pitching and plenty of good material for an outfield Medford would only need a good shortstop and second baseman to have a ball team second to none. Of course such a team could not exist without some aid, something on the same order as given last season. Medford got considerable advertising from the team last season in even the large San Francisco papers.

The Medford team was a ball club that all other teams wanted to beat, even the House of David. Court Hall says on account of business he will not be able to manage the team this season, but is willing to help all he can for a couple of months to get the team organized and started.

In order to enter the league something will have to be done in the next week or ten days. Mr. Hall suggests that Cliff Best be made field captain, and a manager be selected to work with him, and also a business manager be selected to handle the correspondence, money and details.

Dazy Vance announced he was going back to Homosassa, Fla., to build a vacation camp unless the Robins agreed to give him \$25,000. The Brooklyn board of directors announced their top figure would be \$22,500. If Dazy accepted that he'd be the highest-paid pitcher in baseball.

A four-hour session of the registration committee of the Metropolitan association, A. A. U. last night, with Barbuti and several newspapermen as witnesses, failed to develop any new facts which might have permitted the suspension to be lifted.

Barbuti denied many of the published statements attributed to him but stoutly insisted his charges as to over-payment on expense accounts were true and that a "certain A. A. U. official" knew of it.

Chicago Flash Smith carried off individual scoring honors by annexing 244 opens in the third event and totaling 685 for the evening's entertainment.

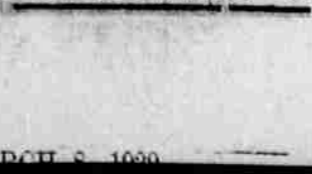

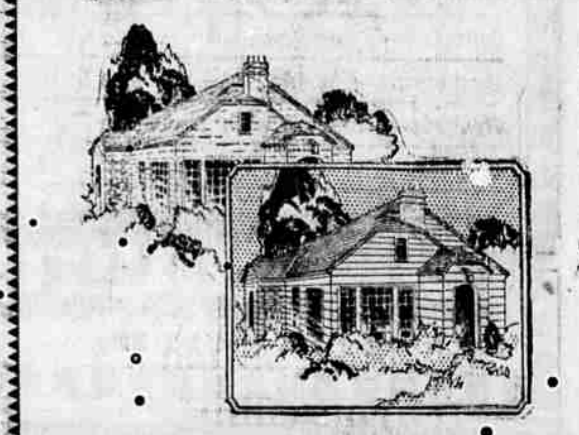
