

LITTLE HOPE FOR NEW HUSBAND OF ANGEL OF FRANCE

SANTA BARBARA, Cal., Mar. 11.—(AP)—Death threatened to halt the round of brilliant social functions at Montecito, fashionable suburb here, which marked the wedding a week ago of Kathleen Burke Penland, wealthy and famous widow of the late, cotton manufacturer, Frederick E. Penland, to John Bonald McLeann, mining engineer, who still was unconscious early today, eight hours after his skull was fractured in an automobile accident.

Mrs. McLeann, who headed the Scottish hospital overseas, and was known as "the angel of France" and "the most decorated woman of the World War," was slightly injured, while her husband was given no more than a "fighting chance" for recovery by surgeons of the Santa Maria hospital, where he was taken.

WORLD COURT JURISTS HOLDING FIRST SESSION

GENEVA, March 11.—(AP)—The committee of jurists, called to Geneva to revise the statutes of the world court, held its first session today, one of the most important items on its agenda being a study on the revision of the U. S. to the court.

He inhibits one while a keeper cleans the other. He is 10 feet 7 1/2 inches tall, two inches shorter than the late Jumbo, P. T. Barnum's favorite.

AIRPLANE FINDS SHIPS FAST IN ICE FLOES

WARSAW, March 11.—(AP)—The Polish steamer Dzew and five Swedish and German craft were reported being carried northward by breaking ice floes today. A reconnaissance airplane discovered the ships which were last reported in the North Sea, near Peckham.

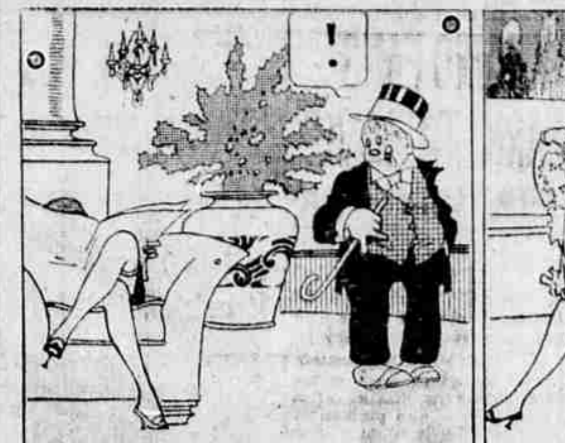

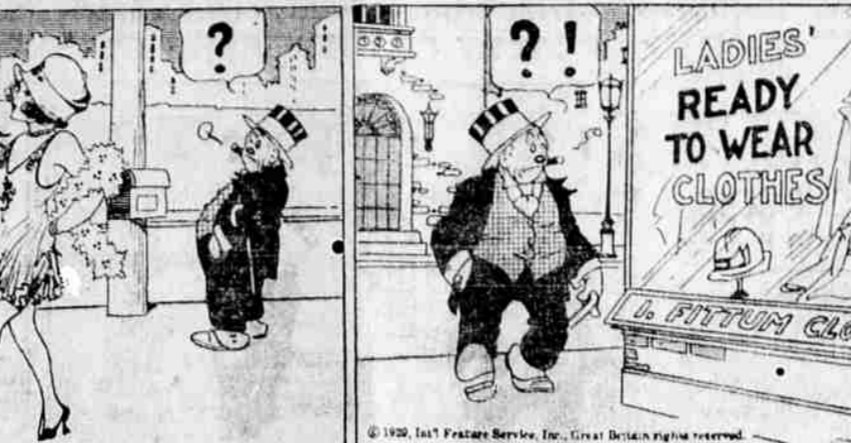
