A two weeks' "love test," which was prescribed by the girl's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Thorne, ended yesterday when the third daughter of the former president of the Montgomery Ward company declared that "for two weeks I listened to my parents' arguments, but found that my love had increased during the separation."

SHORT CAMPAIGN IS HARBOR'S IDEA

NEW YORK, March 13.—(AP)—A proposal for short presidential campaigns instead of the usual long drawn out quadrennial fights was made today by General Jas. G. Harbord, president of the Radio Corporation of America. Declaring that the prolonged months of presidential balloting is only a survival of the limitations of stage coach days, he suggested that the national committees of the two major parties by deferring convention dates could shorten to six weeks or less the prevailing length of campaigns with its consequent "demoralization and interruptions of business and heavy expenses." In the shorter campaign the candidates would make a few carefully prepared speeches over the radio.

STATE SENDS MONEY PAY BOND INTEREST

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 13.—(AP)—To pay principal and interest on state highway bonds, State Treasurer Kay will transmit to the state's fiscal agency in New York on April 1 the sum of \$1,614,389.89. The principal payment will be \$362,500. At the same time the sum of \$997,466.25 will be sent to the fiscal agency to pay interest on war veterans' state aid bonds.

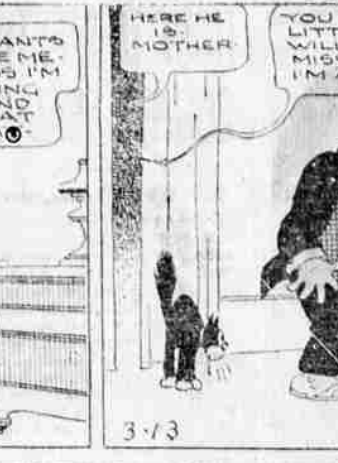
