## TAX RETURN TIME EXPIRES TONIGHT LAST RUSH TODAY

The time limit fixed by the government for filing income tax returns expires at midnight tonight, and altho the office of the deputy internal revenue collectors in the federal building here will be open, it is not expected by the deputies that any belated citizens will be in after 8 p. m. The last minute rush was on today with the deputies able to keep pace with all callers and their income tax return troubles.

This rush as stated yesterday is less than in previous years, due to the people becoming better educated in making out their returns and making them out earlier.

"We have been able to take care of twice as many people and give more service to them, than ever before during the income tax filing period," said Deputy Internal Revenue Collector B. C. Harding this noon adding "at least in my five years' experience with the office here."

Deputy Internal Tax Revenue Collector L. E. Fox was had been busy with callers all forenoon and whose desk was clear at noon, agreed with the statement of Mr. Harding.
