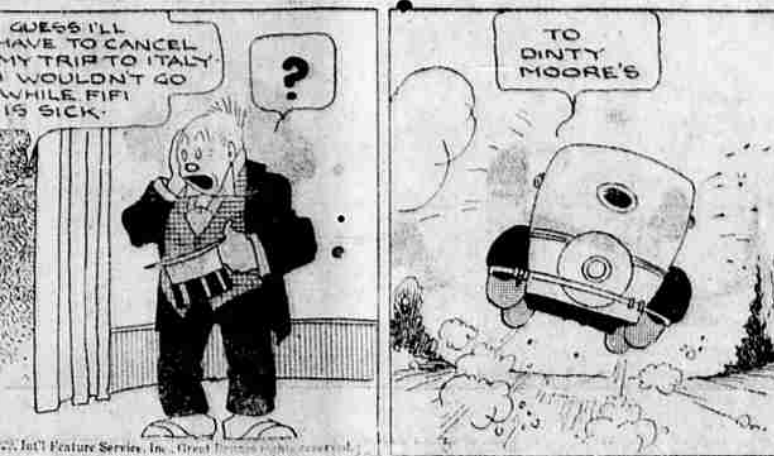

RARE FOX SLAIN FOR LOWLY COYOTE

In the belief that he had killed a young coyote E. B. Griffin, a rancher in the Griffin Creek district, appeared in the county clerk's office this forenoon to collect bounty, only to discover that the pet was that of a gray fox, a breed of wild animal that is very scarce in Jackson county. The fox was trapped after it had attacked Dutton's flock of sheep, and is the first reported killed in Jackson county for years. After exhibiting the hide to several county employees, all of whom had a different opinion as to the kind of pet it was, Dutton received definite information from a local fur buyer.
