### TINKERING WITH TARIFF IS HELD FARM SALVATION

WASHINGTON, March 19.—(AP)—Representative Hope, Republican of Kansas, a member of the home agricultural committee, today said he believed that more direct and noticeable benefit to the farmer would result from revision of the tariff at the approaching special session of congress than by enactment of farm relief legislation. The Kansas said on almost immediate benefit would result for farmers if the duties on imported competitive agricultural products are raised. Prices on domestic commodities would be lowered by the tariff, and farmers would feel the effect at once, he said. Hope said, however, that farm relief legislation was needed to bring about a thorough government and a practical and profitable sound marketing method of disposing of surplus production in order to insure the American farmer a reasonable profit on his products. The lack of prosperity of the American farmer was not due to overproduction, he said, but was the result of an inadequate and poorly developed marketing system.

In the second half the Roseburg team began to hit its stride, and with the score 16 to 16 in Medford's favor uncorked a wild rally that brought the crowd to its feet.
