BROOKHART WILL INTRODUCE PLAN ON FARM RELIEF

WASHINGTON, March 21.—(AP)—The \$1,250,000,000 farm relief program of Senator Brookhart, Republican, Iowa, is going to be one of the many proposals put before the senate agriculture committee when it starts work on a 1929 agricultural relief measure next week.

Brookhart failed to get any support on this proposal at the last session. He is not assured of any now, but he was one of President Hoover's heartiest campaigners and he is confident the new chief executive will give his plan favorable consideration, at least.

S. P. WORKERS TO SEEK HIGHER PAY

SACRAMENTO, Cal., March 21.—Southern Pacific labor leaders have been called to meet in San Francisco March 24 to draft a request for wage increases. It was indicated in Sacramento last night. The request will be presented to Southern Pacific officials at a conference in San Francisco April 1, according to H. C. Kinney of Sacramento, chairman of the negotiation committee of the railroad's shopcraft association.

More than 2000 machinists, boiler-makers, sheet metal workers and car men in Sacramento will be affected. They are now getting a basic wage of 76 cents an hour.

LA GRANDE STRUCK FOUR KILLED IN BY HEAVY WINDS AUTO ACCIDENTS

LA GRANDE, Ore., March 21.—(AP)—Heavy winds during the night coupled with rainfall of 1.91 inches, caused minor damage in La Grande and the Grande Ronde valley. Rivers and streams were running high today, but the rain had ceased and no floods were reported.

Telephone poles were blown down near Union and Minam, and light and power poles were leveled south of Alice and at Elgin, interrupting both services. Wires between La Grande and Bendleton were down for a few hours, with a break reported in the Blue mountains. Eight experienced the heaviest wind in years.
