FINANCIAL WOLF ADMIRABLE ROLE FOR MOVIE STAR

The amusement lovers of Medford, and this time this expression includes the legitimate theatrical goers, as well as the film public, are particularly favored in witnessing another of the latest and best sound moving pictures, or talkies, so soon after issued, in the "Wolf of Wall Street," which opened its several days engagement at Hunt's Craterian theater last night, and which is George Bancroft's first starring talking picture and has won so much praise everywhere it has been shown.

While it is a sound picture in which all the characters speak their parts, one cannot help but think he is witnessing an excellently portrayed drama of unusual interest and merit, which holds intense interest to the very end. This too, is in spite of the fact that no one is killed, there are no suspense paths, and all the human dramas are there—brought out by a love triangle in Wall street financial settings.

While Mr. Bancroft is supported by an able cast he stands out head and shoulders above all others; his characteristic acting in the part of a big, virile and robust man of great physical and mental strength, and his wonderful speaking voice and characterization of the Wolf of Wall Street, will live as one of the best bits of acting ever seen on any stage, in the opinion of those who witnessed last night's shows.

Mr. Bancroft in this film portrays the powerful, ruthless, greedy-for-more-money stock broker, contemptuous of the investing public "suckers," and who manipulates the stock market for the further wealth of himself and confederates, until his reform is brought about thru discovery of a faithless wife.

At will he is all powerful, merciless, humorous, subdued, great-hearted, penitent, full of pathos and so human, carrying his admiring and sympathizing audience with him. Olga Baclanova, the finished Russian actress and former operatic artist whose fine work in moving pictures previously has attracted attention, in her portrayal of the faithless wife in "Wolf of Wall Street" wins stardom in this picture. Especially is her singing at the piano to her lover appreciated. Paul Lukas, as the lover, also wins much commendation.

Above all, the "Wolf of Wall Street" incidentally teaches a powerful sermon against gambling in stocks, and shows the average investing public what suckers they are. R. A. K.
