### SCOUTS TO PITCH CAMP ON TRAILS OF EARLY MINERS

Scouts who attend Camp Applegate this year will be given an opportunity to make an extended camping trip over some of Oregon's early gold trails.

The first miners to come into the Oregon gold fields in 1850 and 1851 came over the old Cook and Green Pass trail to the middle fork of the Applegate river, and from there soon established the gold camps of Uniontown and Jacksonville, Jacksonville, with its memories, museums and historical recollections of its golden days, was more fortunate than Uniontown, which was wiped out in the Indian raids. Uniontown had a sawmill and a few buildings which were destroyed at the time the settlers were killed, and the camp never was rebuilt. The site of this old town is but a few miles from Scoutcamp.

The scouts this summer will have an opportunity to take the old Cook and Green trail past a good many deserted prospectors' cabins and old diggings; will have an opportunity to reconstruct and relive the days of the gold rush going from their camp to Cook and Green pass, along the Siskiyou divide to Windy peak and to the Gold Ledge mine. Windy peak lookout will be visited and instructions given in locating fires; from there a number of mountain peaks, old gold camps and historical landmarks will be sighted, located and checked on the map. En route they will see some splendid specimens of the weeping spruce, macnab express, and will have a chance to collect some very good specimens for their botany and forestry tests.

Those scouts interested in birds will find in the higher country a number of new birds that do not nest in the valleys and are not seen by the ordinary camper or tourist. Coming down from the Blue Ledge mine they will pass a whole series of mines, formerly producers, on Joe creek and Elliott creek.

This trip will be of several days' duration and each day will have new sights, new scenes and new work; the base being Camp Applegate. Each scout, before he takes the trip, will demonstrate his ability to take care of himself in the matter of camping and cooking before he leaves the base, as once started on the trip, there will be no turning back.
