

PEOPLE'S ELECTRIC BUILDS MINIATURE OF LANDING FIELD

If any one is in doubt as to what the proposed new airport will look like when finished, he has but to look in the window of the People's Electric store, where Don Trowbridge, and others of the electric staff have designed and built a complete miniature of the landing field and the various features to be carried out in the local project.

A model hangar, in which a plane is parked, a wind indicator, a radio station with all broadcasting towers, topped by beacon lights, pilot quarters, passenger daps and other buildings are represented in the miniature setting.

Such details as the flood lights for the field, flags at the top of the towers and service automobiles are carried out with faithful exactitude, and the set is being studied by local residents who will vote for the new airport in the coming election.

All that the people of Medford and the valley can say in the way of apology to the visiting D. A. R. convention and other visitors, for this morning's unexpected snow storm is that such a thing hereabouts is very unusual and peculiar, and they will understand, for they have undoubtedly used the same apologetic expression at times in their own towns in the past.

Honestly now, folks, this snow on the third day of official spring was most surprising even to the oldest residents here, and there will probably be more of it, as cloudiness tonight and Saturday and probably showers and snow flurries is the forecast.

Two inches of large, flakey snow fell continuously in Medford and vicinity for two and one-half hours this morning, starting in at 7 a. m. However only one inch fell at the base of the foothills. Ashland had four or five inches.

The Greenspring mountain road had six inches of snow by this noon, and the Pacific highway over the Siskiyou had also had six inches at this time, and it was still snowing on both mountains.

The snow in the Medford and Ashland sections was of such large loose consistency it began to pack down and disappear late this forenoon.

While reports received at the local weather bureau by late this forenoon were not complete, it was thought there that snow had fallen over southwestern Oregon, and probably most of southern Oregon. Reports of snow all the way between here and Yoncalla, Ore., were received, and an unofficial report was received that at Anchor which is some distance from Wolf Creek, the snow depth was 14 inches.

It rained more or less all last night up to 3 a. m. Between 5 p. m. yesterday and 5 a. m. today 1.18 of an inch of rain had fallen.

The snow began early last night in the mountain districts. Motorists arriving in the city late last night from Klamath Falls reported that they had difficulty driving over the Greenspring mountain road, facing a blizzard of snow most of the way over the mountain.
