Now let's hear what the trappers think about animals chewing their way to freedom. The state game commission, to settle a controversy over how long Rogue river steelheads remain out of the river before returning and what percentage of them do not return, is marking a large number of the fish before they are liberated from egg-taking stations. This is being done at the Bear, Antelope and Little Butte creek egg-taking stations by cutting the left ventral fin from each fish after it has spawned and is ready for liberation. Sportsmen are asked to cooperate with the commission and report catches of any of the marked fish. It is believed that the experiment will aid in determining what percentage of the fish return to Rogue river after spawning.—Oregonian.
