

TEXAS SLAYER OF HANDSOME PASTOR WILL DO 3 YEARS

TYLER, Texas, April 2.—(AP)—Sentenced to three years in prison for the murder "without malice aforethought" of the Rev. Fount Wallace, handsome pastor whom he accused of intimacy with his wife, Lois Wilson, young Troup, Texas, garage man, prepared today to appeal his case to a higher court.

A jury reported its conviction of Wilson yesterday after 24 hours' deliberation, while the Rev. H. H. Wallace, the slain man's father, was preaching an Easter sermon in a nearby church. Wilson declared he killed the pastor a year ago because Mrs. Wallace had broken a promise to "put the preacher out of her life." It was alleged he walked up to the Rev. Mr. Wallace, shouted "Prepare to meet thy God," and shot him down.

Mrs. Wilson, a choir singer in the minister's church in Troup, testifying for her husband, told of three intimate "love trysts." Prosecution presented testimony to contradict her story of two of them.

The Rev. Mr. Wallace, who was 26 years old, formerly was a well known football player in Kentucky.

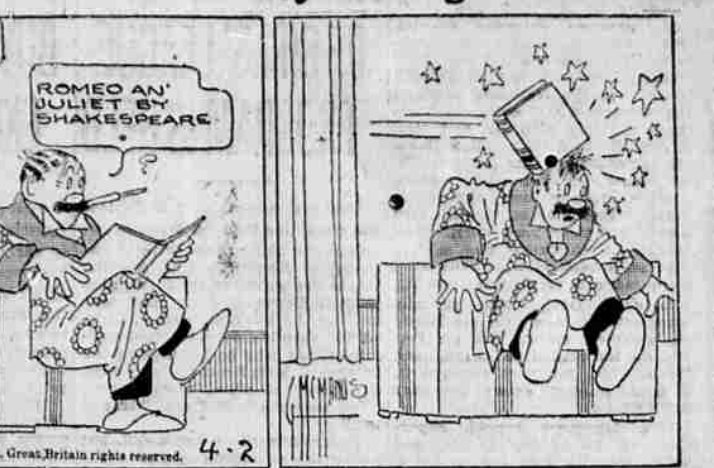
