Pete Burleson and picnic party enjoyed a picnic at Lake Creek Sunday.

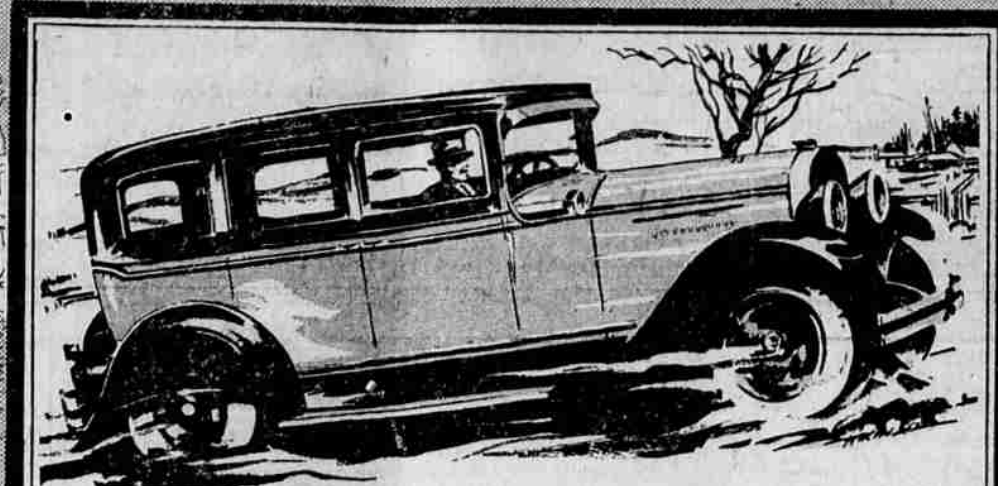
The eight-line telephone meeting will be held Thursday, April 4, at 2 o'clock. All shareholders should be present.

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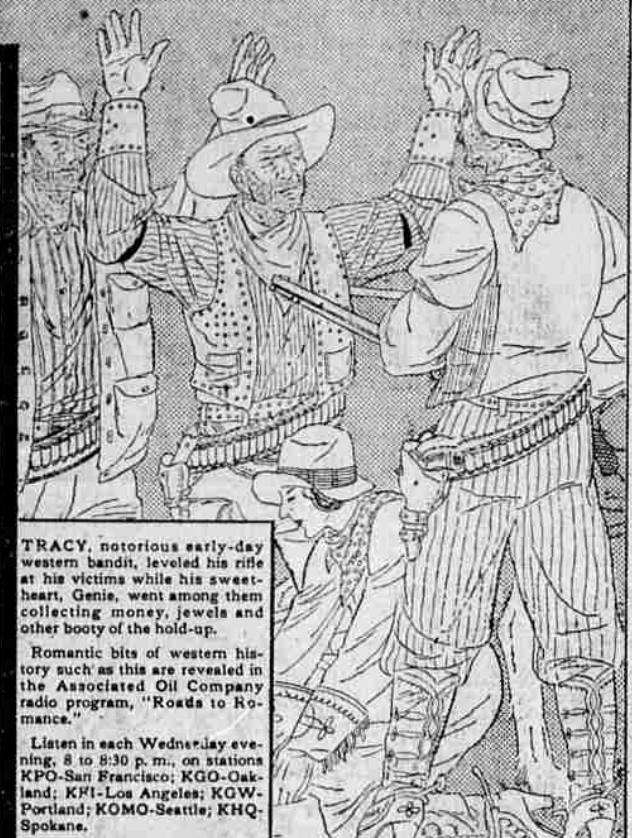
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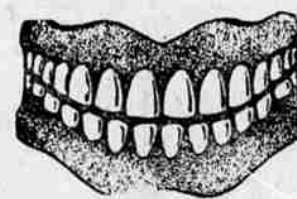

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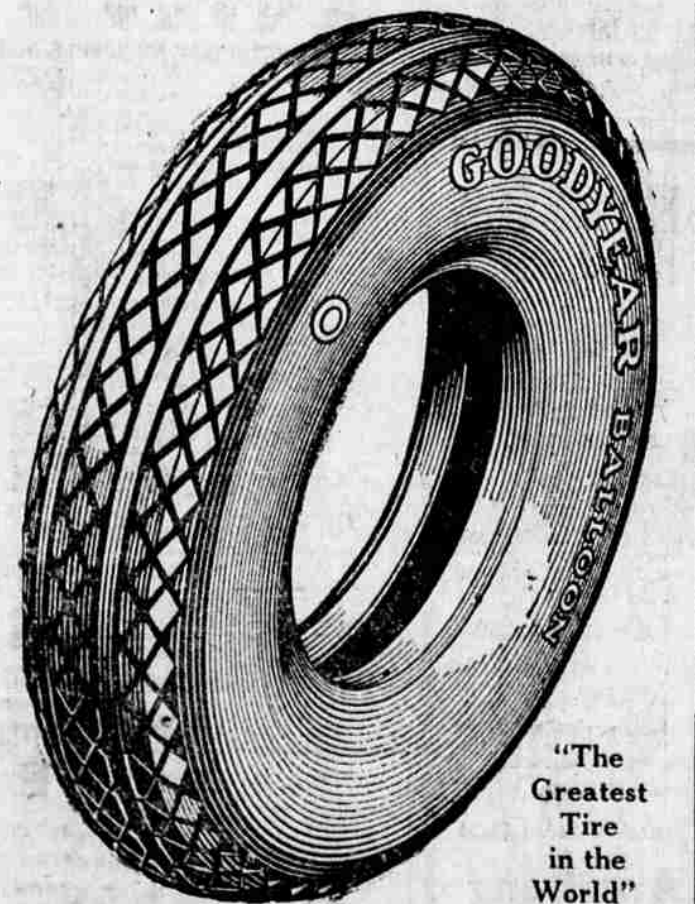
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
