BANK RESOURCES SHOW GAIN OVER FIGURES FOR 1928. ORCHARDS ALERT, FEAR FREEZE IN VALLEY TONIGHT

The stability of Medford's financial health was again shown in the recent publication of statements from the four local banks, showing combined deposits and resources of \$5,962,917.74. This total reveals an increase for the same period last year and is indicative of the growing condition of the banking institutions. Out of the four, one bank is in the two million dollar class, and two others are rapidly reaching that point.

Figures compiled yesterday show savings accounts to be an important feature of Medford's financial life, with a total of \$2,972,375.04 included in time deposits. Demand deposits have a total of \$3,202,538.15, making a total of \$5,274,913.19 for both divisions. For instant distribution, the banks have cash on hand amounting to \$879,226.78 and have combined loans and discounts of \$2,841,240.27. The buildings in which they are located, including fixtures, have a value of \$255,104.50.

Flurries of snow ranging from very light flakes to big ones, and even in the form of hail continued to fall today at times, following the snow flurries of last night, the most of which melted away almost as fast as falling, but still left a measurable quantity this morning, amounting to .01 of an inch.

The weather is very much unsettled and unofficially almost anything in that line is liable to happen within the next day, but the official information given by the local weather bureau is the following: "Cloudy tonight, with freezing temperature and Saturday fair." In view of the unsettled condition wise citizens will take the precaution of seeing that their fuel bins contain enough coal or wood, etc., to stand some disconcerting weather for a day or so more, at least.

The lowest temperature of last night and this morning in Medford was 29 degrees, but at the Talent experiment station, the minimum was 27 degrees.

While it is generally conceded that the snow and rain are excellent for the crops, the orchardists are sort of uneasy until the weather settles again, as they fear a frost, especially as the forecast tells that the cloudiness of the early part of tonight will give way to fair weather for Saturday.

Therefore, the frost reports of this evening by Floyd Young, the frost expert, will be awaited with some eagerness.

While the flurries of snow were falling in Medford last night and today, heavy snow was falling in the mountains and foothills, according to reports reaching the city today.
