DES MOINES, Ia., April 6.—(AP)—At least four persons are dead and scores are suffering from injuries, burns and cuts received in a fire which broke out at the Kirkwood Hotel, shortly after 3 o'clock this morning. Fire Chief Burnett, after inspecting the wreckage, expressed his belief that several additional bodies might be found. He said a group of men and women had been reported holding a party in one of the rooms, and had not been found since. Firemen were almost unanimous in believing that more victims were buried in the debris.
