

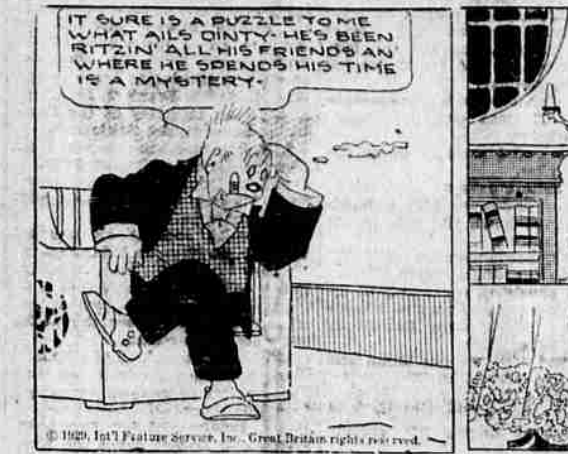
DAIRY AND PRODUCE MARKETS UNCHANGED

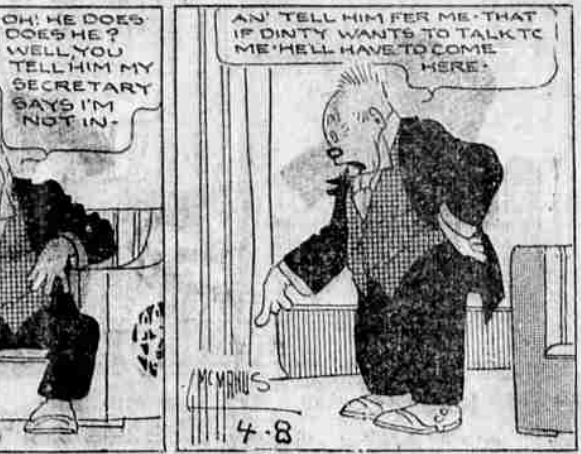
