

PORTLAND POLICE MAKE MISTAKE IN ARRESTING YOUTH

PORTLAND, Ore., April 12.—(AP)—Although Selwyn Bingham, son of a prominent Portland contractor, was convicted by a city court jury of disorderly conduct and resisting an officer, and was fined \$10, Mayor George L. Baker issued a statement today indicating that he believes the young man innocent of misdemeanor. Bingham was arrested at 12:30 a. m. March 21 as he sat in a parked automobile with a young woman. Arresting officers say Bingham struck at them and became disorderly when they placed him under arrest. Bingham said, however, that the policemen struck him first. Patrolman Roy Sims was forced to resign from his post, and Patrolman C. L. Miller was suspended for ten days by the city administrators "for using undue force in making an arrest." The policemen testified during the trial that Bingham threatened at the time of his arrest that he would "get" these jobs.

CROP CONDITIONS SPOTTY IN STATE SAYS OSC REPORT

CORVALLIS, Ore., April 12.—(AP)—The monthly agricultural situation report for March, issued by the agricultural economics division of the extension service of the state college, indicates that Oregon increased acreage in corn, barley, hay, oats and possibly onions, and reduction in potatoes, spring wheat and possibly fall wheat, depending on spring abandonment. Crop conditions are reported spotted with the late spring lampering farming operations, coupled with shortage of moisture in some dry-land sections, although snow supplies for irrigation water is unusually plentiful. Some damage to early fruit from frost is reported, although it is too early to predict fruit prospects in general. "Oregon farmers intend to increase their acreage of corn 15 per cent, compared with last year," the report says. "Spring wheat may be decreased 30 per cent. Oat acreage is expected to be three per cent larger, as compared with a 10 per cent jump for other western states, while Oregon farmers will expand their barley acreage 15 per cent as against but five per cent for the entire west. "Potato acreage in Oregon will probably be reduced 12 per cent, about the average for the entire country, but less than for the state of Washington and other western sections. "Hay acreage will likely be increased about three per cent."

DOUG AND MARY PLANNING SCREEN ACTION TOGETHER

HOLLYWOOD, April 2.—(AP)—From "Pleasant" beautiful home of Douglas Fairbanks and Mary Pickford, came the definite announcement today that the motion picture colony's two most famous stars were to appear together for the first time in a screen production. Although the casting of "Mary" and "Doug" in a motion picture had been rumored for many months, official confirmation was lacking until today. To add to the motion picture fan's delight, the couple will appear in the first Shakespearean production to be attempted in recent years by the movies. The story to be filmed will be the comedy, "Training of the Birds." In their announcement, the couple, who in private life are Mr. and Mrs. Douglas Fairbanks, said that the picture will be an "all talkie," probably in colors. Work on the production is planned to begin the first week in June. "Mary" and "Doug," the leading stars of Hollywood, stand, although they have appeared separately in numerous memorable pictures, never have been filmed together, and the announcement consequently was received with the greatest interest among producers and stars.

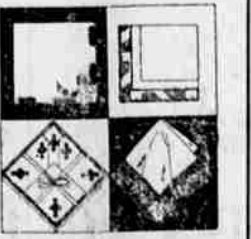

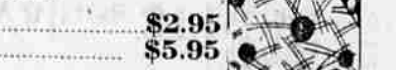
