PORTLAND, Ore., April 13.—(AP) Egg prices went flying upward today, due, it was said, to another effort to halt premium paying at other points. All grades advanced two cents, standard extras halting at 28, standard firsts at 27, medium extras at 25 and medium firsts at 24.
