

POLICY OF PARTY TOLD BY BALDWIN IN STUMP SPEECH

LONDON, April 19.—(AP) Premier Baldwin laughed the election campaign of the conservative party today with an address before 2000 representative conserva-

tives from all parts of the country, in which he characterized the policy of his party as a steady going forward one and promised its continuation and development.

"Ours is a policy of sobriety which you can see through," he said, "of nursing our trade into better condition, of looking after the education and health of our people and particularly of our women and children, a policy which goes into every home and every cottage throughout the country."

Young Couple With Moonshine and Car Dangerous Quartet

CHICAGO, April 19.—(AP) Edward J. Tokin, superintendent of Cook county schools and in that capacity supervisor over the schooling of 100,000 children, believes that "a young couple, a bottle of moonshine and an automobile are the most dangerous quartet that can be concocted for the destruction of human society."

Superintendent Tokin is one of six men, prominent in education in Cook county, who are acting as jurors in the coroner's investigation of George Lusk's death Sunday afternoon at a rooming house with several young men and girls. In a statement last night he attributed the death, and conditions leading to it, to prohibition.
