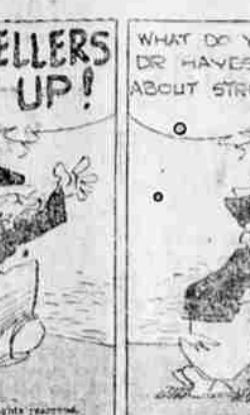

WILLAMETTE VALLEY FRUIT CANNERS SLOW TO CONTRACT CROPS

SALEM, Ore., April 20.—(AP) Uncertain conditions in the canned goods trade, shown in the hand-to-mouth buying of eastern dealers, is being reflected in the usual spring activity of packers in contracting fruit in the Willamette valley, a survey made by the Capital Journal among growers and packers operating in this field reveals.

Contrary to what is usually the case, packers are contracting only for what fruit is needed to fill booked orders in most cases, and it is generally conceded that there is more uncontracted fruit in this section than for many years past.

Practically no loganberries have been purchased and most of those signed up quote only the prevailing market price being paid by the buyer at the time of delivery.

Practically all of the 1928 pack of other varieties of fruit have been cleaned up, the canners report, except for a few apples and blackberries still held in western Washington.

But even this cleanup has not operated to stimulate buying in anticipation of the present season's needs, although the packers assert they can see no reason why the entire fruit production will not be handled this year, with the exception of logans.

Both growers and packers are optimistic over the strawberry outlook and a good crop and good prices are both predicted. Prices being written into this contract range from five cents up, with that price prevailing for Marshalls for handling.
