

HIJACKERS TAKE GAMBLING MONEY TORONTO HOLDUP

TORONTO, April 22.—(AP)—Authorities were confronted today by a variation of the hijacking racket in the robbery of a gambling resort money car, carrying \$55,000.

Four gangsters held up six men in an automobile carrying the winnings of a "big money" game from the resort on the outskirts of the city at 6:30 p. m. yesterday.

While the passengers in the money car were being searched County Constable Travenner drove up. Two of the robbers aimed shotguns at him, but he escaped and drove to a telephone to summon aid. When he returned the robbers and their victims had disappeared.

The Toronto Globe said today that Joseph Attelman, formerly of Rochester, N. Y., a partner in the club where the game was conducted, was the heaviest loser. Frank Barrows, another partner, was quoted as saying he did not think the amount reported to be stolen was correct.

INCREASE RUM TAX IN MEXICO TO CURB USE PLAN OF SECRETARY

MEXICO CITY, April 22.—(AP)—Increased taxation on alcoholic beverages and a reduction in the alcoholic content of beer has been decided upon by Secretary of Finance Montes de Oca as the most effective way to cooperate with President Portes Gil in his campaign against the drink habit in Mexico.

The secretary has informed the press that these measures will be adopted in order to discourage the sale of intoxicating liquor. He did not specify the amount of the proposed increase in taxes, nor the limit that will be applied to beer, but indicated they will be sufficient to have a retarding effect. The limit of the alcoholic content of beer in Mexico at the present time is 8.8 per cent.

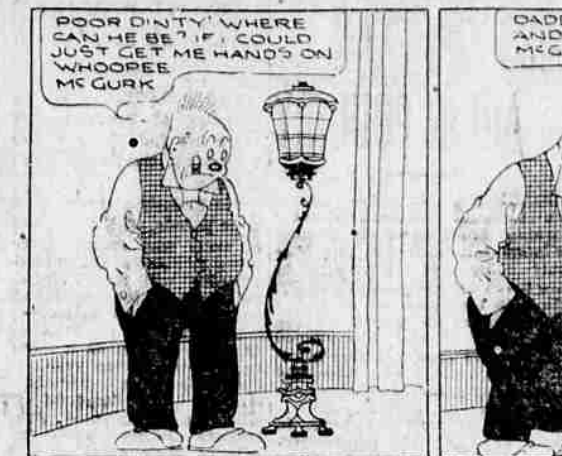

NEW YORK, April 22.—(AP)—Easing credit conditions stimulated a general recovery in prices in today's stock market. Buying orders were distributed over a fairly broad list, gains of 1 to 7 points being quite common, with larger advances by a few high priced specialties. Trading showed a tendency to increase on the rally, indicating a broadening of public participation in the market.

Public utility stocks were in brisk demand on merger rumors and reports of new alignments in the eastern field. Adams Express closed 16 points. American Telephone can up more than six points to a new record at 236. American and Foreign Power, American Power & Light, Federal Light and Traction, North American Company and Western Union sold three to five points higher.
