## PLANS COMPLETE FOR TRACK MEET AT FAIR GROUNDS

Preparations are complete for the big annual Southern Oregon Field and Track meet at the county fairgrounds, beginning 9:30 tomorrow morning. The first rural event, a volley ball contest, will begin at 8:30, but town contests will not begin for a half-hour later. Rivalry in the town division is expected to be close, with four schools—Gold Hill, Central Point, Phoenix, and Jacksonville—with a complete entry list for every event. The grounds are in perfect shape and all is in readiness for the opening of the contest. Fred McDonald will be the announcer of the day and B. R. Finch will be the official starter for races, while Albert Fitch will be the manager in charge. The judges have been chosen and come principally from this city.

The meet has a significance of its own in that it comes only a few days ahead of May Day, also recognized as National Child Health Day, and will be an exhibition of healthy boys and girls in contests of which health is the main factor.
