8:00 P. M.—Vaudeville show and entertainment in the Shrine Auditorium for all visiting Shriners and their ladies.

Monday, June 3. All special trains arriving will be met at the depots by patrol escort and conducted to the various hotels.

9:00 A. M.—Special excursion for Imperial Divan, Representatives, and ladies; also wives of recorders, to Catalina Island, visiting the world famous marine gardens in glass bottomed boats.

Luncheon served at the St. Catherine Hotel, returning to Los Angeles at 6:00 p. m.

10:00 A. M.—Annual meeting Recorder's association, Biltmore Hotel.

7:30 P. M.—Banquet to Imperial Divan, Past Imperial Potentates and ladies, in honor of Imperial Potentate Frank C. Jones.

7:30 P. M.—Annual banquet of the Jesters. This banquet will be given in one of the motion picture studios of Hollywood, where the banquet room will be transformed into an early California mining camp scene. This banquet promises to be the most unique affair of its kind ever given.

8:00 P. M.—Mammoth vaudeville show at Shrine Auditorium for all visiting Shriners and their ladies.

A large Hawaiian string orchestra and a modern dance orchestra will furnish the music for the occasion. MISSOURI MAIDEN SHOWS PARIS HOW TO DESIGN SHOES

JOPLIN, Mo.—(AP)—When Mary Bendelari, 16-year-old daughter of a Joplin mine owner, went to Europe six years ago she was just one of the army of post-war tourists. When she came home this spring she had gained international distinction as an authority on modish footwear. She owns a smart shop in Paris, where she sells what her French factory makes, and designs for several continents. Miss Bendelari was just out of art school when she went to Europe. Her business of selling handsome shoes to the elite began as a hobby with \$3000 capital, a gift of her father.

She was intrigued one day when she noticed some unusual shoes of leather and woven cord, worn by Balkan peasants. She made a drawing and sent it to a store. They ordered 200 pairs. She didn't have one pair, but she hired a Bohemian shoemaker to copy the drawing, using straw instead of the original woven cord. The result was the Beauville sandal.

The Joplin girl established a factory and began with a small crew of skilled shoemakers. Now the factory is in two buildings and 100 employes call the Missouri miss "la petite patronne," their "little boss."

Miss Bendelari later opened the retail establishment, and out of it grew other shops in various countries. She considers an important style trend at present to be the development and use of pajama slippers. Rogue River valley—The scenic paradise of the world.

SYDNEY, Australia.—(AP) Hailed as "the first step in the socialization of industry" in Australia, the co-operative working of the Cata-

maran coal mine, in Tasmania, has broken down. The enterprise started in 1927, when the company decided to close the mine because it would not pay. After negotiations with the union the company made a two-year agreement with the men to hand over the mine to them and pay them an agreed rate per ton for all coal produced. The men will not renew the contract.
