CARNEY CAPTURES GIANT STEELHEAD WITH SMALL FLY

A monster steelhead for this section of southern Oregon was caught in the Rogue river yesterday afternoon in the Dodge bridge locality, which set all local anglers agog when they heard of it yesterday or today.

The capture was made by Tom Carney, who is classed as an expert amateur angler and who captured a prize offered several years ago by a Medford sporting goods store for catching the largest salmon of that season.

The steelhead captured yesterday weighed 12 1/2 pounds and, hard for local anglers to believe, it was caught on a No. 10 Royal Coachman fly after a royal battle of two hours and 45 minutes, during which Carney waded back and forth up to his armpits much of the time, it is said, fighting the big gamey fish back and forth over a quarter mile distance, taking him beneath the bridge a number of times.

So exciting was the battle that auto parties coming along and hearing that Carney had something unusually big on the end of his line, stopped, and soon the road in the bridge vicinity was lined with cars, and also many other anglers gathered to witness the struggle and its outcome.

It is very rarely that so large a steelhead is landed in this section of the state, it is said, although sometimes caught in streams in the northern part of the state.

Carney's catch yesterday is claimed as a record breaking one for the Rogue River valley.

W. H. COPE, MOVIE PROMOTER, DIES IN ROSEBURG CRASH

W. H. Cope, former well known moving picture studio promoter in Medford who, during his residence of a year or so here while promoting the Rogue River Studios, which venture was only partially completed, and who for the past year had been residing in Roseburg, where he formed a company for that city to erect a proposed studio, died in Roseburg last Saturday of injuries sustained when he was struck by an automobile.

During his residence in Medford he lived at the Hotel Medford except for a short time before going to Roseburg. Mr. Cope was well known throughout Oregon, as he had resided in this state for 10 years, having been engaged in several motion picture promotion enterprises. He was instrumental in securing the construction of a building for a proposed studio at Beaverton and another at Eugene among other ventures.
