

HOME PRODUCT BANQUET WILL BE BIG FEATURE

Chamber of Commerce Has Arranged Program of Instruction and Entertainment—Dodson, Arnold Will Speak.

The second annual Community Home Products Banquet, staged by the Medford Chamber of Commerce, with the assistance of the Rotary, Kiwanis and Lions clubs, bids fair to be one of the best attended and most enthusiastic community meetings ever held in this city. The program for the banquet has been carefully arranged to provide the greatest amount of enjoyment and instruction possible, and tickets for the affair are already at a premium.

The banquet will be held in the basement of the Elks' temple at 6:30 p. m., Thursday, May 9, and those attending are urged by the committee in charge to be on hand promptly in order that the program may begin on time.

The principal speakers of the evening will be W. D. H. Dodson, manager of the Portland chamber of commerce, and P. B. Arnold, president of the Arnold Sales Training Institute of Los Angeles. Each of these speakers comes to Medford most highly recommended, and will undoubtedly have messages which will mean a great deal to this community.

The entertainment part of the program will be furnished by the Burton Sisters' orchestra, and is composed of five young ladies who have recently moved to Medford from Eugene. This orchestra has established an enviable reputation for entertainment work, which includes not only orchestral numbers, but singing and dancing as well. In addition to the speakers mentioned, John C. Mann, retiring president of the Medford Chamber of Commerce, and Carl A. Swigart, incoming president, will make brief talks on the work of the chamber and its program for the coming year. The annual report of the organization, which is now being printed, will be distributed at the dinner.

There will be a number of out-of-town guests for the banquet, including the masters of nearly all of the Granges in Jackson county, the presidents and secretaries of the Chambers of Commerce of Ashland, Klamath Falls and Grants Pass, and others who will be introduced at the meeting.

The committee in charge of the arrangements is composed of W. S. Bolger, chairman; D. G. Tyree, C. A. Meeker, W. W. Allen and C. N. Culy. Mr. Tyree will act as toastmaster.

LISTEN FOR THE VOICE OF THE SKY HERE TOMORROW

"The Voice of the Sky" is scheduled to be heard tomorrow in Medford. This ingenious invention, which set New York and the entire east agog, is making its first Pacific coast appearance. A giant tri-motored plane will soar overhead at a height of 2500 feet. Suddenly it will burst into animation. Snatches of music, hearty human laughter, crisp sentences will be plainly heard by pedestrians on the street, in the factory and by the housewife.

"The Voice of the Sky" is a tremendously amplified sound impulse. The announcer sits in a tiny cabin in the plane, which is heavily insulated to shut out the roar of the engines, speaks calmly into a microphone, and his words travel along a wire through the amplifying sets which are located just behind the door to the pilot's compartment then into the reproducers and out through three huge horns. Their flared mouths open on the underside of the fuselage. Each horn is equipped with nine powerful sound reproducing units, making a total of 27.

Four small, short bladed propellers provide all the power for generating the 2500 watts of current necessary for operating the mechanism.

"The Voice of the Sky" is a development of many years of research. Its mission here is to aid in publicizing Standard oil's new gasoline of the Standard Oil company of California. It is expected the plane will stay Thursday night at Medford.
