## CUBS RISE TO TOP NATIONAL LEAGUE FIELD

Hubbell's No-Hit Flinging Overshadows Mc Carthy Team's Fight — Giants Continue Circuit Swings — Ott Connects Twice

The furor created by Carl Hubbell's no-hit performance against the Pirates at the Polo grounds yesterday all but prevented any mention of the Cubs' rise to the top of the National league standing, but there the McCarthymen stood today after a long fight upward. The Bruins slammed the recumbent Robins for a businesslike 4 to 2 victory at Ebbets field yesterday as the thoughtful Cardinals tucked the Braves under at Boston, 10 to 2.

In the face of Hubbell's effort, however, the league standing became a thing of small moment. Practically a freshman in the major leagues for all of the fact that he is a regular and a star, this slender Missouri southpaw gave the Pirates' team batting average such a jolt that the Buccaneers slid into last place in that activity. The Giants won by 11 to 0.

Hubbell lost all chance of a no-man-to-first-base game almost as soon as he entered the box. Travis Jackson made a giddy loss past first base of Sparky Adams' grounder, and the wee infidel rared to second. Lloyd Warner's sacrifice sent him to third, and Hubbell was concerned more with preventing the Pirates from scoring than in pitching a no-hit game. The Giants continued yesterday to hit home-runs. Mel Ott got two, lifting his total to six, the best National league figure, and Pullis and Andy Cohen got one apiece.

Waite Hoyt won his fourth straight, Lou Gehrig hit his seventh home-run of the season, and the Yankees collected their sixth successive victory as the Browns were sunk by 8 to 1 in St. Louis yesterday.

The champions combed Walter Stewart for 12 hits, running their six-game total to 75. Babe Ruth cut in with two useful singles. The triumph was needed to keep the Hugmen on top, as the Athletics executed an about face in Chicago, winning by 5 to 4 behind old Jack Quinn, Yerkes and Shores. Red Faber and George Connelly worked for the White Sox. Red Long. Credit for the victory went to Shores.

Cleveland defeated Boston by 3 to 1, and Detroit nosed out the Senators by 5 to 4 in other American league games. Phil Collins, Philadelphia recruit, defeated Cincinnati by 3 to 2, giving Burt Shotton's boys their third straight victory.

## EDWARDS SWINGS ON WALKER WHEN CRAB HOLD HURTS

PORTLAND, Ore., May 9.—(AP)—George Walker, Canadian heavyweight wrestling champion, defeated Billy Edwards, Kansas City, here last night in a rough match which ended in a free-for-all, with both wrestlers, referee, several spectators and policeman mixing in a lively set-to in the ring after Walker was awarded the third fall, when Edwards started swinging his fists at Walker. Edwards won the first fall with a double reverse Japanese toehold after wearing Walker down with his knuckle headlock. After 12 minutes Walker hooked Edwards with a crab hold, the latter pounding the mat to save himself. After four minutes wrestling Walker again forced Edwards to pound the canvas with another crab hold. Walker had 14 pounds weight advantage in coming in at 192 1/2 for Edwards.

In the preliminary Fred Mortenson took one fall and the decision from Jim Thor.
