

TRAFFIC MISHAPS KILL 16 IN OHIO DURING HOLIDAY

CLEVELAND, May 13.—(AP)—Sixteen persons were killed and 31 were injured, 12 seriously, in Ohio traffic accidents over the week-end. The worst was in critical condition today as officials opened an investigation into the collision of a Cleveland-Detroit bus near Toledo early Sunday morning.

E. D. Waring, 36, driver of the bus, and Godfried C. Froyap, the truck driver, spent last night in jail at Monroe, Mich., while authorities there began their inquiry. Froyap said he had stopped to repair his engine and that he was in the cab trying to get the truck under way when the bus side-swiped it. Waring told officials he was blinded by the lights of another machine and did not see the truck in time to avoid collision.

Most of the passengers were asleep. The dead were Frank Cindrich, 21, of Trenton, Mich.; H. Westerman, 30, of Chicago; Mrs. Emma Mauterlin, 60, of Los Angeles; an unidentified girl, about 17, believed to be from Cleveland; and an unidentified man about 42, thought to be from Detroit. The four most seriously injured were in the Monroe hospital today.

Louis Moses, 26, his wife, Ruth, 24, and their daughter, Mary, 5, were killed in a crossing accident near Canton. Two other young Moses children and Carl Townsend, 39, driver of the car, were not expected to live. Eight others were killed in collisions and accidents caused by slippery streets.

CALIFORNIA FRUIT LOSS IS SHOWN

SACRAMENTO, May 13.—(AP)—First authentic figures showing the extent of the frosts of early April upon California's fruit crop have been issued by the federal state crop reporting service. These are contained in the monthly summary of the service compiled from reports gathered by the department's field representatives.

The clingstone peach crop will be but 36 per cent of the normal, the service announced, or less than half that of last year when the crop was 87 per cent at a corresponding date. The Sacramento valley was hit from 80 to 95 per cent, as county averages, and the San Joaquin valley from 20 to 75 per cent.

The southern California crop is reported as anywhere, or less than one-third the state average, or 55 per cent of a normal, against 86 per cent last year.

EL DORADO Ark., May 13.—(AP)—Search was being continued today for four men, three of them alleged members of the "Ace" Pendleton gang, who locked the jailer and a trusty guard in cells and staged the second break from Union county's new "break-proof" jail yesterday.

The four, Claude Burnett, Joe Streiter, Owen Edwards and Carl Drey, were believed to be in hiding in the bottoms adjacent to the Ouachita river east of El Dorado.

Burnett, Streiter and Edwards were to have been arraigned in circuit court here yesterday. For Streiter, a trusty guard in connection with the robbery of a Junction City, Ar., bank several months ago.
