

NAVY CONTRACTS FOR 4,665,000 BARRELS OIL FROM RICHFIELD

Contracts to furnish the United States navy with 4,665,000 barrels of fuel oil during the 12 months beginning July 1, 1929, have been awarded the Richfield Oil company of California, according to official notification just received by the company from Washington. Richfield secured every award covering which it entered a bid.

In addition, the navy awarded contracts for delivery during the same period of 188,000 barrels to other Pacific coast ports, on none of which Richfield bid.

Richfield's present current deliveries, and which will continue, in addition to the navy business, are averaging 1,250,000 barrels monthly, the great majority of which is on contracts, some still to run for four and one-half years. The company recently constructed additional bulk storage at Portland to handle increasing fuel business, and is contemplating new tankage at Seattle.

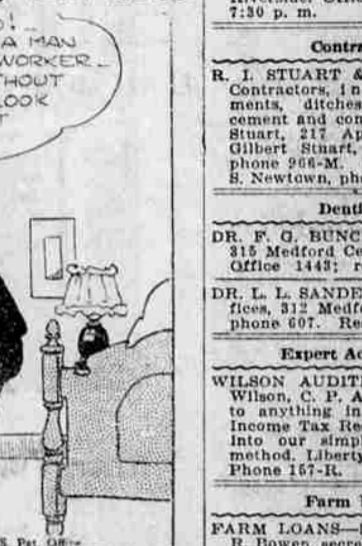
