## DUNCAN SINKS 40-FOOT PUTT TO BEAT HAGEN

### Eagle Three On Home Hole Continues Jinx of Englishman Over British Open Champion—Jurado Bows to Twins, Three and Two.

MOORTOWN, Eng., May 15.—(AP)—Walter Hagen and three of his stalwart compatriots were defeated today in the first two rounds of the Yorkshire Evening News 1000-guinea professional golf tournament, leaving the task of upholding American golfing prestige in the capable hands of Leo Diegel and Joe Turnesa. Only these two invaders survived the mighty blows dealt by British veterans and their own comrades, too.

MOORTOWN, Eng., May 15.—(AP)—Walter Hagen, American Ryder cup captain and four times holder of the British open title, was beaten in the first round of the Yorkshire Evening News 1000-guinea golf tournament by George Duncan of Great Britain today.

Duncan, who headed the British Ryder cup team that conquered the American squad a fortnight ago, downed Hagen one up. Duncan sank a 40-foot putt at the hole to beat the American star for the second time. He defeated Hagen by an overwhelming score in the Ryder cup matches.

Jose Jurado of Argentine was beaten by W. T. Twine of Great Britain, three and two. Duncan always has been a jinx for Hagen. The American star never has beaten him in match play.

Today the British open champion was never more than one down and finally was beaten at the home hole only because Duncan's great 40-foot putt went down for an eagle three.

Hagen's third shot lay at the lip of the cup.

## LEWIS DISABLES DICK DAVIS COURT

WILMINGTON, Cal., May 15.—(AP)—Dick Davis, heavyweight wrestler from Kansas, was unable to continue after being thrown out of the ring by Ed "Strangler" Lewis in a wrestling match here last night. Davis, who claims a head injury, was thrown in a backward body slam which resulted in Lewis being awarded the match. The fall, the only one of the match, was obtained by Lewis after one hour and eight minutes of furious wrestling.

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15.—(AP)—Billy Edwards, Kansas City light heavyweight wrestler, won over Ed Wirth, Detroit, here last night. Wirth took the first fall in 18 minutes with a toe hold. Edwards took the second fall in 15 minutes 12 seconds with the old school stunt of "kicking the cat." Seventeen minutes after the intermission Edwards was awarded the final fall after Wirth had picked Edwards up for an airplane spin. Both men were stunned when they fell to the mat, but Edwards, less groggy of the two, pulled on top of Wirth and was awarded the decision. It was one of the most vicious matches seen here. In the preliminary, Bill Thornton took one fall and the decision from Fred Mortensen.

## SIGHTSEEING TOUR IS ONLY THING LAGGING IN CONCLAVE PLANS

Preparations for the L. O. O. F. grand lodge sessions next week in this city are entering the last stages of completion, and indications now are that everything planned for the care, comfort and pleasure of the large delegation of visitors will be in readiness when the lodge delegates begin to arrive Sunday.

There is possibly one exception, and that is the sightseeing tour. To date not enough cars have been volunteered to assure the success of this proposed feature. C. C. Hoover and his assistants are actively engaged in securing the requisite number of cars, but so far there is considerable of a shortage.

Mr. Hoover is appealing to the citizens of Medford to rally to his undertaking. It is not alone the idea to afford the visitors a pleasant little auto jaunt, but to give them a panoramic view of some of the industries and other things which contribute to the development of this valley in general and Medford in particular.

It is anticipated that the convention delegations, when their labors are ended, will accord Medford citizens a premier place for enterprise, prosperity and hospitality; but it is desired to have the further and equally important recollection that Medford is a wonderful little setting in one of the natural valley gems of the west.

People can gain more in a few hours of touring and inspection than they can in literature and talk. What may be said would probably in a short time be forgotten, but what the eye conveys to the mind lingers indefinitely.

Those citizens, therefore, who have the public interest at heart should respond more encouragingly to Mr. Hoover's solicitation and see that there will be ample cars to take care of the crowd. It is as much, if not more, to their interest to see this undertaking through to a success.

The trip proposes a drive through the box factory and mill district north of the city, then out to the airport grounds, on through Central Point to the West Side driveway, through historic Jacksonville, along the south foothills to Phoenix and back to Medford. It is estimated the trip will consume about an hour and a half, and afford quite a glimpse of the industrial resources hereabouts.

But bear in mind the success of this undertaking depends upon the cooperation of the people in providing cars. To date the number is quite small. For those having cars, but unable to accompany them, good, responsible drivers will be furnished.

### TAKE PRECAUTIONS FOR OUTING SEASON

The house is built on the letter H plan, which means that every room has cross ventilation and also divides the house, conveniently into service, sleeping and social quarters. The grounds are just as attractive—from the circular drive which leads to the front door to the lily pond in the back. Every tree, flower and vine seems to have its own place to fill.

Another home very interesting and unique in design is the new Spanish house built by Prickett. The house is unusual in plan and interior decoration. They have planned it themselves and Mr. Prickett has done a great deal of the interior finishing, including the wrought iron balcony railing and light fixtures. There are many noteworthy features which must be seen to be appreciated.

The Brit home in Jacksonville, one of the old landmarks of the county, is surrounded by an old-fashioned garden that is most delightful. To see the natural beauty of this garden, which has not only been preserved by the years but also been enhanced, is to appreciate it.

The John Anderson home north of Central Point is equipped with a cold storage room which is the latest and most convenient method of preserving the products of the ranch before being taken to market. It is automatically operated by electricity, and is very inexpensive to run.
