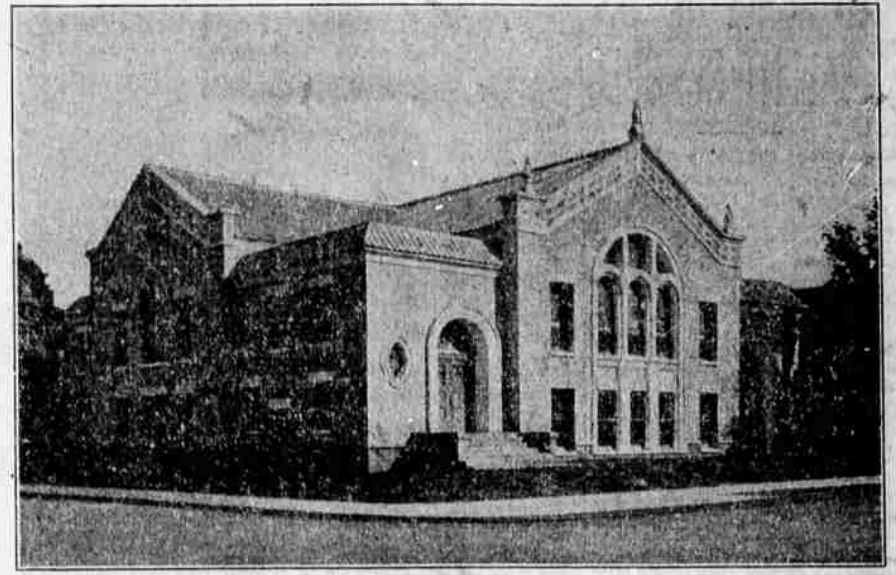

Rayon Rivals Silk in Beauty and Strength

Rayon has come into its own. Instead of basking in the reflected glory of its resemblance to silk, it now stands on its own merits as a lovely and durable fabric. Laundering does not detract from the beauty of rayon. If the right methods are used, the fabric seems to improve each time it is washed. Plenty of soapsuds and water of an even lukewarm temperature are essential throughout the process of washing and rinsing articles made of rayon. The fabric should never be wrung or squeezed but should be plunged in and out of soapy lather until all signs of soil have disappeared. After several rinsings, the water should be pressed out gently and the article rolled in a towel to dry. As rayon is more often injured in the ironing than in the washing, care should be taken to keep the iron from becoming too hot. It is advisable to press the article on the wrong side while it is still quite damp. Rayon, as well as other washable materials, will give better service if it is laundered frequently than if dirt is allowed to become embedded in its surface. Much time and effort may be saved in making a dress if every seam and every part as it joins another is carefully pressed. This eliminates much basting and will make the turn for hems, pipings and folds more secure than basting stitches.

Odd Fellow Harmony During the Civil War

It is not generally known that during the civil war there was no division among the Odd Fellows of the north and the south. The schism and division that marked that great struggle did not enter into Odd Fellowship circles. Harmony was maintained throughout the four years of the struggle and there were no wounds to be healed when the strife was over. Brethren of the order from the north and the south fraternized with each other when engagements were over and no identified Odd Fellow was neglected.

ANCIENT CATHEDRAL IN DANGER OF FALL

FERRARA, Italy (AP)—The twelfth-century cathedral of Ferrara, one of the oldest in Italy, is in momentary danger of falling down. The city authorities have appealed to the government for engineers to plan its immediate strengthening. The central nave especially is liable to fall at any moment. "Healthy Chick" Movement

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP)—The "Healthy Chicks" campaign has become a national movement. It is designed to check the tremendous mortality rate of chicks during the first eight weeks of their lives. To Test Eggs: Place an egg in a pan of water. If fresh it will be on its side. If a few days old, it will tilt upwards. If stale, it will stand on end. If very old, it will float. A Convenient High Chair: If four rubber-tipped door stops are screwed into the legs of an ordinary chair, it makes an ideal high chair for kitchen work, or for a small child. Peeling Onions: Pour hot water over onions, allowing them to remain for a few minutes, then drain and pour cold water over them. Then the skins can be removed easily. A Substitute Bodkin: A smooth cotton pin for thin or lacy material makes an excellent bodkin. The pin holds the material securely. When darning large holes in stockings, puckering of the cloth may be avoided by darning over black mosquito netting which makes a good strong foundation but is not uncomfortable to the feet. This also helps to keep the hole in its original shape.

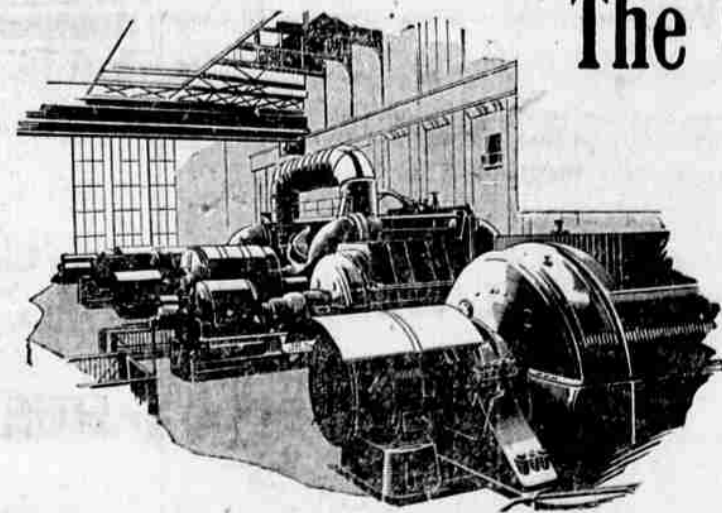
