

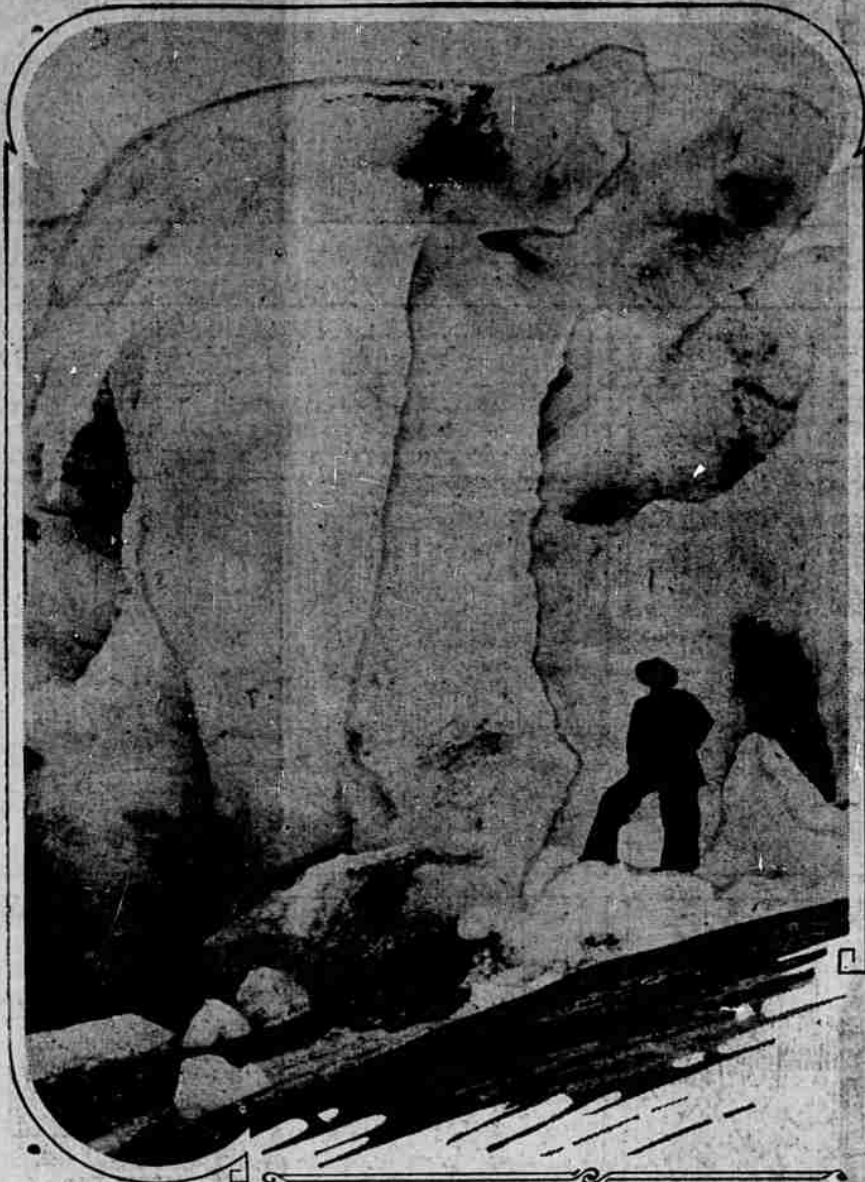

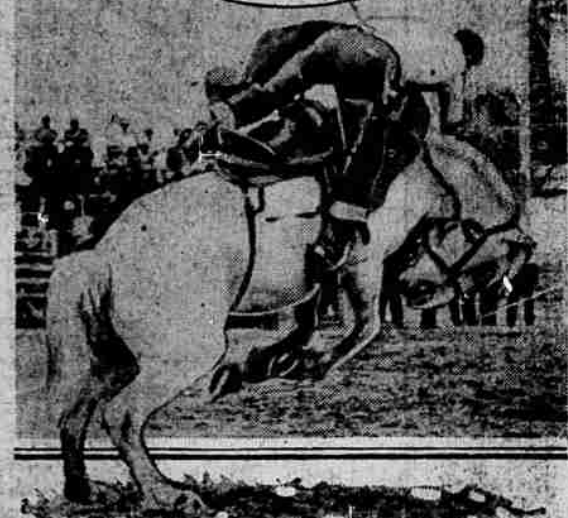

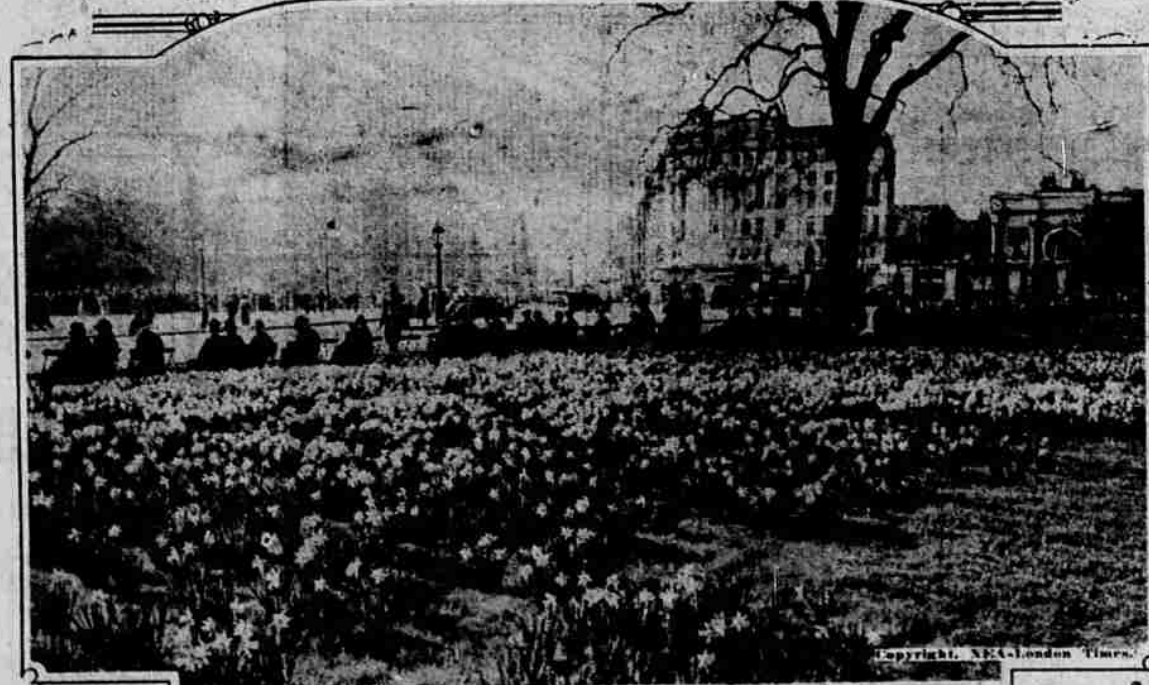

THE PLACARD TELLS THE SAD STORY. The girl is Frances Miller of Baltimore, and she carried the sign at the recent field day of Wellesley College.



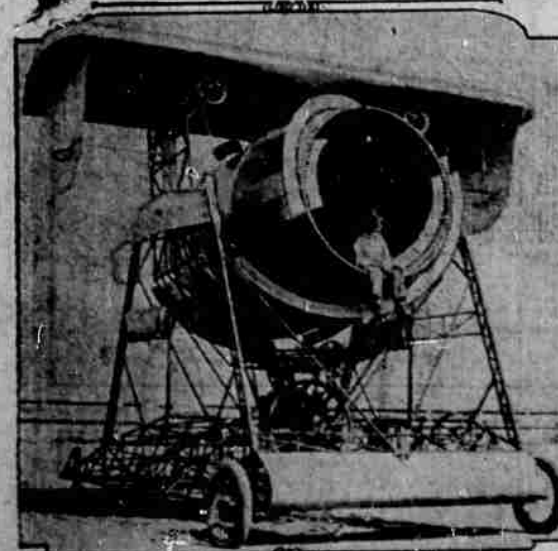
HE'S THE MILLIONAIRE HOBO. J. Eads Howe. The picture was taken in Washington during a recent hobo convention.

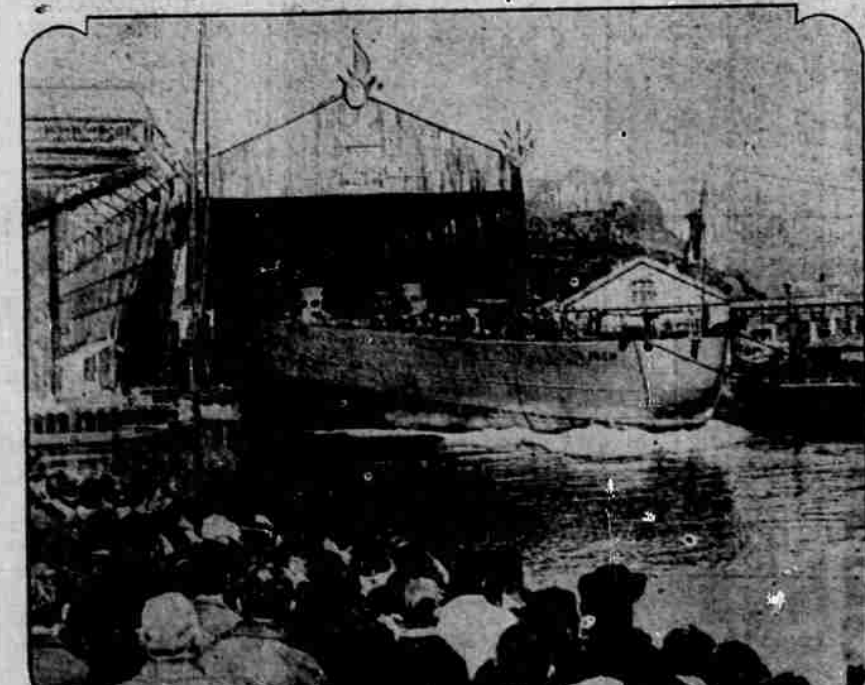
