A WAR TO THE DEATH IS ON

WE hope the police have the men who staged that murder and robbery near San Diego the other day.

For this crime demonstrates that gunmen and racketeers have invaded the Pacific Coast.

There was a time when crime, particularly robbery, had what might be termed its own moral code.
