Mr. Johnston had just mounted "Spitfire," a promising filly recently purchased from Frank Preston of the Applegate, and was galloping to his gate near the Dodge bridge to greet some guests for dinner, when he met a neighboring farmer boy coming in the opposite direction, who was putting his horse through some wild maneuvers.

Apparently taking this as a signal to imitate the antics of the approaching cayuse, Spitfire proceeded to jump in the air, shake himself like a hooked steelhead, and execute other fantastic stunts.

Thanks to always being in perfect physical condition, and well trained in the art of relaxing during a fall, Mr. Johnston escaped injuries which would have been serious. Unfortunately, however, his entire weight came down upon his right arm and a nasty fracture resulted.

It will probably be a month or six weeks before Mr. Johnston can again cast for steelhead or swing a maul on the Medford golf course. Needless to say, his enforced absence will be felt keenly in all branches of local sports.
