

MAGILL'S STORE REMODELED BY LOCAL FIRMS

Medford Concerns Deserving of Credit for Craftsmanship—Home Products to Be Used at Magill's—Albright Supervises Work

Practically all of the fixtures of the new Magill drug store were furnished by local firms. Joe Albright, of Bend, who had general supervision over remodeling the place, was the only out-of-town man on the job.

Lampport's, dealers for Heath and Milligan paints and varnishes, supplied all the material for the decorating of walls and ceiling, and also furnished some of the hardware.

Painting and decorating in the new store was done by W. F. Grinstead, well known Medford decorator, who has had charge of several large remodeling jobs recently, one of these being at the Rex cafe.

Plate glass for the attractive front windows, cabinet work and hardwood floors in the window show case came from the Trowbridge Cabinet Works.

Materials for remodeling Magill's were hauled by the Edie Transfer company, and the light reflectors and Marquise fixtures were made by the Modern Plumbing and Sheet Metal company.

A large stock of candy, tobacco, fruit syrups and other products from the Valley Candy company will be used at Magill's.

Wiring throughout the drug store was done by the Independent Electric company. The Parker Tile company, with headquarters at Lampport's store, put in the art tile at the entrance of the place.

Eight floor show cases, wall cases and up-to-date fountain are products of the Weber Show Case and Fixture company for which Blumauer Frank Drug company of Portland, are distributors.

Snider's Dairy, the Home of Gold Medal products, has the exclusive contract for all cream, ice cream, milk and butter for Magill's. The People's Electric installed a Frigidaire system at the fountain.

Linoleum for the floor came from Weeks & Orr's furniture store and the Medford Furniture and Hardware company furnished a portion of the hardware for the Magill establishment.

All of the paints and varnishes used in renovating Magill's drug store were purchased from Lampport's and are products of Heath and Milligan.

During the past week demonstration of this line of material was put on in front of Lampport's store by E. L. Martin, of San Francisco, special representative of the company. Three cars were painted free of charge, the advertising features of extraordinarily quick drying and ability to cover worn off surfaces with but one coat of paint being demonstrated.

The Heath and Milligan factory is one of the largest and most scientifically equipped paint and color plants in the world today and was established in 1851.

The J. K. Gill company of Portland, book sellers, stationers, and office outfitters, will supply a complete line of school books, kodaks, and supplies, gift wares and leather goods for the Magill drug store.

Products of the J. K. Gill company are well known as quality goods which will be a welcome addition to the extensive stock of drugs and toilet articles to be carried at Magill's.

LLOYD MAGILL HEADS DRUG STORE CHAIN

Medford Store Is Fourth Magill Drug Store Since 1916—Owner Impressed By City—Cruikshank Here for Decorating.

Lloyd H. Magill, of Bend, proprietor of Medford's newest drug store, arrived here Tuesday to complete arrangements for opening local establishment Saturday morning. Mrs. Magill will also be here over the week end.

The owner of Magill's does not limit his interests to one business but takes an active part in a number of sports, golf and trap shooting being his favorites. He is well known in trap shooting circles in this part of the state.

Three years after graduating from O. A. C. at Corvallis, in 1912, Mr. Magill spent two months working for Dr. Robinson in his drug store in Jacksonville. That experience doesn't account for the Rogue River valley's appeal for the druggist he admitted in an interview Wednesday.

Since 1916 four drug stores have been established by Mr. Magill, two of these at Bend, his home city, one at Klamath Falls and the fourth in Medford.

SOCIAL STATUS TO GUIDE DOG POUND AT LAKE FOREST

CHICAGO, May 30.—(AP)—Lake Forest has become doggy no end. On advice of the suburb's police chief the dog pound hereafter will segregate the animals in accordance with their social status.

"They will be graded just like cattle," said Chief Lester Tiffany. "Pedigreed dogs in one class, 'nutty' in another."

Mrs. Irene Castle McLaughlin, a leader in the movement to provide better homes for stray dogs, doesn't think much of the idea, and neither does Mrs. William Swift, J., another society woman who has taken an active interest in the establishment of dog refuges.

"It isn't fair," Mrs. McLaughlin said. "Pedigreed dogs should have no more consideration than the others."

Mrs. Swift said: "Lake Forest should not distinguish itself by being snobbish to dogs." She characterized the proposal as a "typical Lake Forest trick."

ENGLISH DEATHS OVERTOP BIRTHS DURING EPIDEMIC

LONDON, Eng., May 30.—(AP)—Deaths exceeded births by 44,112 in England and Wales in the first quarter of 1929 and the total deaths in the period numbered more than 294,000, an increase of 68,000 over the corresponding quarter of 1928.

The hitler cold spell and the influenza epidemic made the first three months the second worst on record in the country so far as deaths were concerned, fatalities being exceeded only in 1919 when a great influenza epidemic was raging.


