

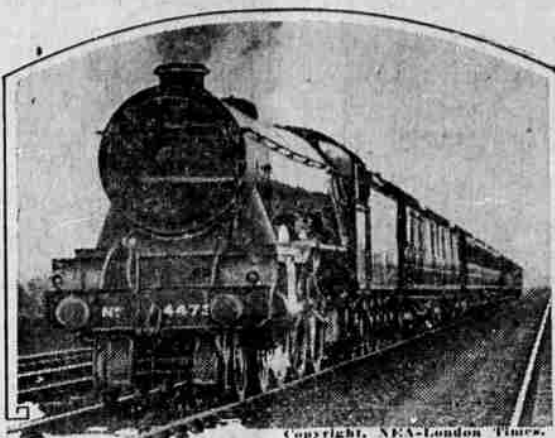

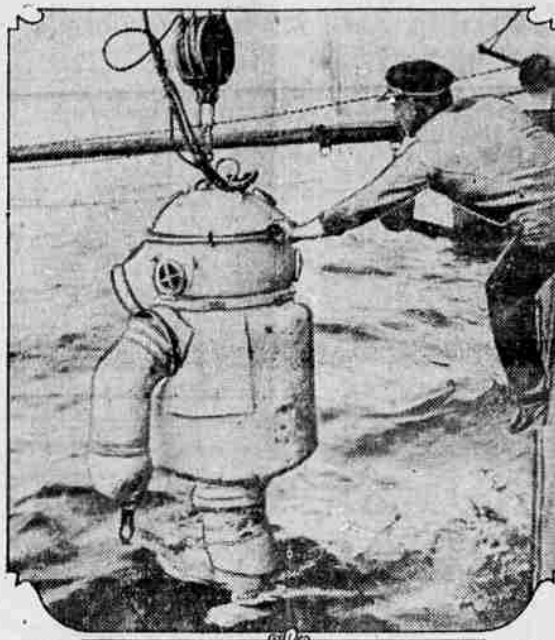

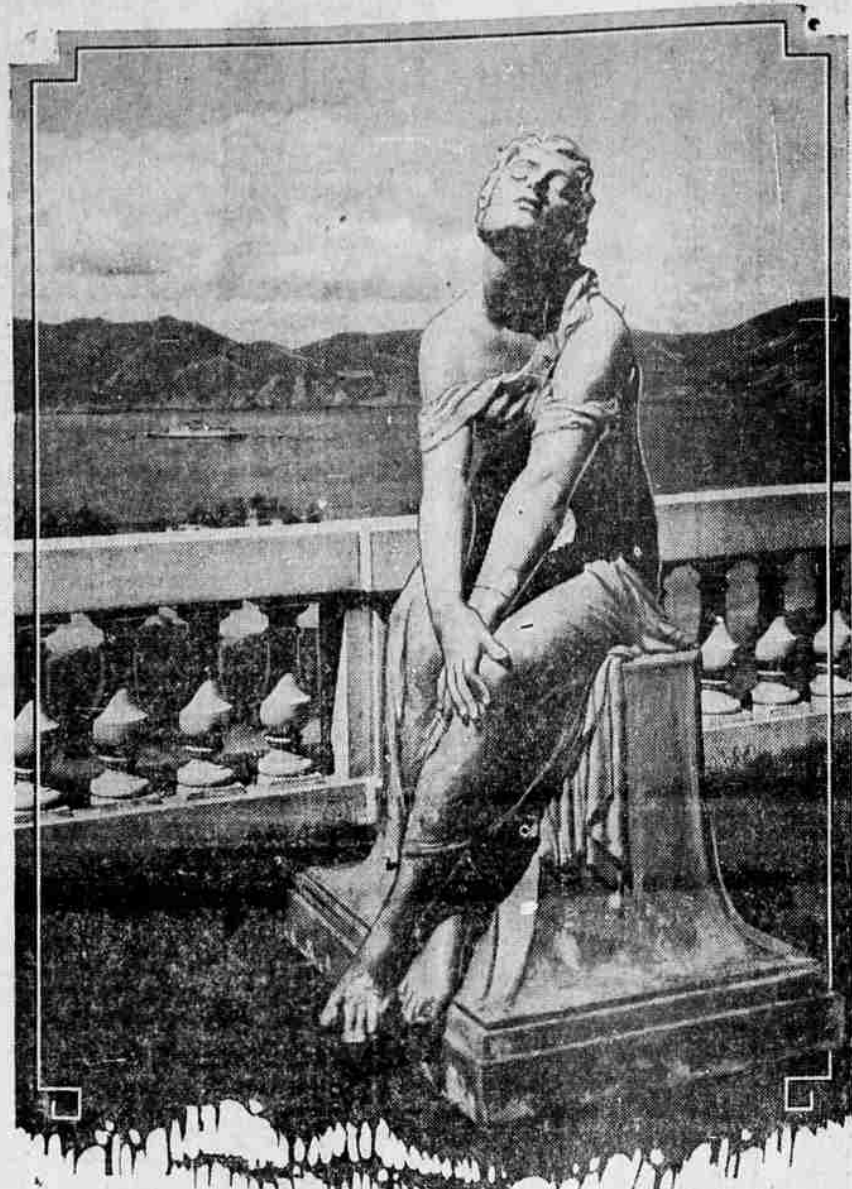

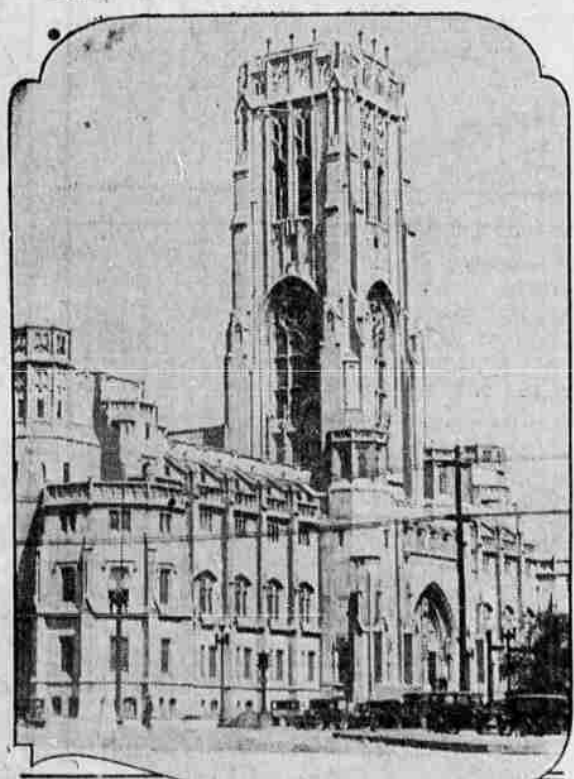

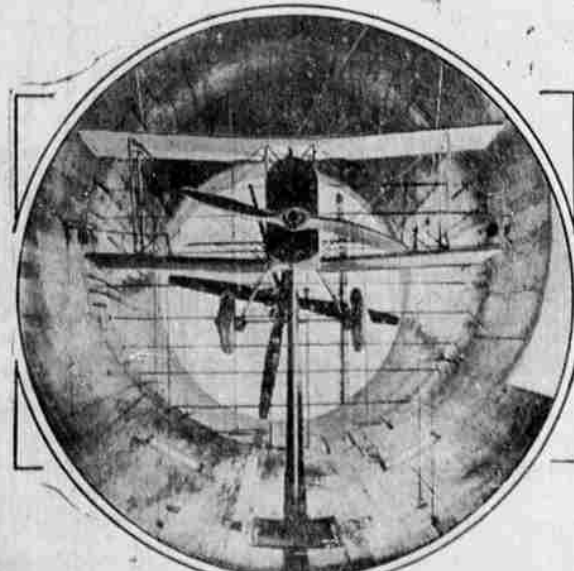
THIS POSSUM picked out a good home for himself—the White House, no less. One of the White House policemen is shown holding the new boarder who wandered into the grounds.
