TELEPHONE FROM A MOVING TRAIN

WINNIPEG, June 2.—A successful attempt to carry on a telephone conversation from a moving train to a given number in the city, was made on May 31, by the Canadian National Railways.

The experiment took place outside of Toronto and was carried on while the train was proceeding for a considerable distance westward. The first call was put in by W. D. Robb, vice president of the Canadian National Railways, who talked with W. G. Barber, general manager of the Canadian National Telegraphs.

A novel feature was the fact that Mr. Robb's conversation telephoned from the train was transmitted from the telephone in Toronto to the microphone of CNRT, the radio station of the Canadian National Railways in Toronto, and broadcast by that station and received through the receiving set on board the train from which Mr. Robb was speaking.
