

FELINE MUSIC BRINGS FRESNO BOYS TO CELL

Burglarized College Lab to Secure Ether for Annoying Cats—Policeman Interrupts Project and Takes Students to Jail.

FRESNO, CAL., June 7.—(AP)—Three Fresno state college students are in jail today, charged with burglary, because one of them made up his mind he was going to put a quiet end to the nocturnal solos and choruses of pussycats.

The three youths, all of them 18 years of age, broke into the state college chemistry laboratory in the deep of night and emerged triumphantly with a large can of ether and varied assortment of test tubes, retorts, crucibles and a gas burner.

Imagine their embarrassment, however, when police stopped them, and not only that, but began to ask questions. With their arms and pockets full of pharmacists' supplies, they broke down and rather sheepishly admitted ransacking the chemistry department.

Dick Wilkins, brother of the school's star hurdler, said it was all his fault. His landlord liked cats, even the kind that vocalized their joys and sorrows at night, and would not get rid of them. So he took the responsibility on himself, enlisting the aid of his two companions.

The ether he intended to put into a mixture which would forever end the ill-reputation and songs of the landlord's cats. And with the test tubes and other equipment he hoped to catch up on his laboratory assignments with no interruption of ghostlike noises.

Sounded logical all right, but also sounded like burglary. For a while, therefore, Wilkins will be safely away from the feline music.

DISCIPLINE COP FOR NEGLECT IN TALLMAN CASE

Police Captain Bean Let Slayer Slip Out On Ship Is Charge—New Theories Given in Escape—Search Vessel at Sea.

LOS ANGELES, June 7.—(AP)—Police Captain James Bean, head of the Los Angeles homicide squad, today was under suspension for "apparent negligence" in investigation of the slaying of Mrs. Virginia Patty, and in failure to arrest William L. Tallman, radioman suspect.

Deputy Chief James Lyons, who announced the veteran investigator's suspension last night, said Bean had been in possession of Tallman's name and description and had been informed of his whereabouts four hours before the suspect sailed from San Pedro, Calif., aboard the steamer Admiral Benson last Tuesday afternoon.

Tallman escaped from the ship before it docked at San Francisco. Captain of Detectives Al Blaten, who took over direction of the investigation, succeeding Bean, announced additional clues which he said pointed to Tallman as the slayer. These included signatures "W. L. Tallman" and "W. C. Johnson"—on the register at Tallman's hotel, and at the rooming house in which Mrs. Patty's body was found with head battered, trussed to clothes hooks in a closet behind a folding bed.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 7.—(AP)—Theories to account for the disappearance aboard the steamer Admiral Benson, of William Tallman, Los Angeles radio operator, continued to be advanced today. While police of the San Francisco bay district conducted a search for the young man, sought as a suspect in the slaying of Mrs. Virginia Patty in Los Angeles, detectives aboard the vessel, en route for Portland, began another search.

Although detectives made a minute inspection of the Admiral Benson while she lay at her pier here, they said they were not satisfied Tallman was not hidden aboard the vessel. They said they believed a man could remain hidden on the ship indefinitely if he was aided by members of the crew. Accordingly, when the Admiral Benson reached the pier another search was started.

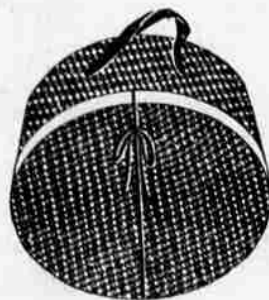
