

# PICK HUGHLING AS INSTRUCTOR FOR SWIMMERS

## Sessions From June 10 to 20 Under Red Cross Auspices—University of California Expert Conducted Last Year's Campaign Here.

The instructor who will be in charge of the classes during the swimming and life-saving campaign to be conducted in Medford from June 10 to June 20, inclusive, will be George Hughling, it was announced Saturday by W. W. Allen, chairman of the local Red Cross chapter.

Hughling who is instructor in swimming at the University of California, will be remembered as the man who conducted a very successful campaign in Medford last summer. He has been a member of the summer staff of the life-saving service of the Pacific Branch, American Red Cross for the past three years. As a representative of this service he has directed life-saving instruction and conducted swimming and life-saving campaigns all along the Pacific coast. For two years preceding his employment as a regular member of the staff, he rendered volunteer service for the Red Cross at such institutes and campaigns. Hughling has developed at the University a life-saving course which is the largest affiliated course on the Pacific coast and one of the largest in the United States. # NATIONAL GUARD LEAVES TUESDAY FOR CAMP DRILL

Next Tuesday at 5 p. m., the Oregon National Guard units of Medford, Company A 158th Infantry, 60 men and officers, and the new Headquarters company, Third battalion, 17 men and one officer, leave on a special military train that will start from this city for the annual 18 days' encampment of the guard at Camp Clatsop. Company A has only one vacancy, that of bugler, and up to last night this had not been filled. Write the special train does not depart until 5 p. m., the men of Company A will report at the army at 9 o'clock in the morning and remain on duty all that day transferring their equipment and loading it on the train, etc. The special train will pick up on its way north other National Guard units at Grants Pass, Roseburg, Eugene and other western Oregon points.

The Ashland coast artillery company will not be on this train, as only the infantry, field artillery and engineer and brigade troops will train at Camp Clatsop this year, and the coast artillery will go to Puget Sound for the annual training period. A most complete and extensive program has been outlined for this year's camp. Capt. C. Y. Tengwald of Company A says, the main feature being a big combat demonstration, which will be held Saturday, June 22. Over 20,000 people witnessed the mock battle last year. It is in the nature of an actual battle demonstration by artillery, infantry and machine gun units, using the most modern equipment in the way of field guns, trench mortars, automatic rifles and machine guns. In addition to the training work, there will be a big athletic program arranged for one afternoon of the camp. Numerous improvements have been made at the camp this year. New roads have been built, "how-to" buildings constructed, ice boxes remodeled and renovated, and the combat range overhauled. Baseball diamonds have been provided at both ends of the camp, and an improvised stage for entertainment purposes has been built.

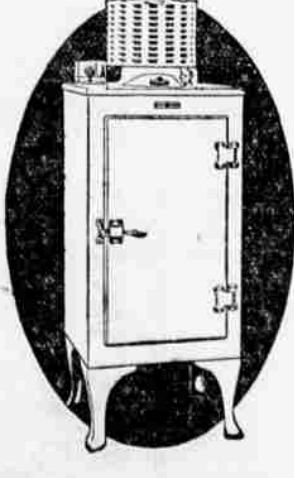
