SALEM, Ore., June 13.—(AP)—The monthly report of Clarence A. Lee, state insurance commissioner, shows a total fire loss in Oregon outside of Portland during the month of May of \$229,833. The total number of fires was 92. The most serious losses were a laundry and equipment at Eugene, \$50,000; a cannery with equipment and contents at Hillsboro, \$25,000; and a barn, bottling plant, garage, horses, and equipment in Multnomah county, \$22,500.

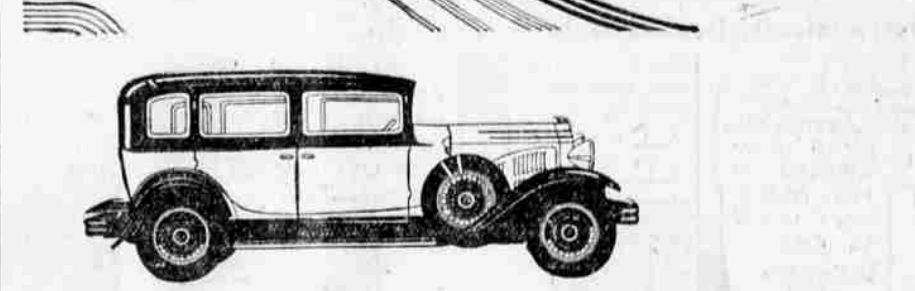
