The planes are expected to arrive between 10:30 and 11 o'clock, and a good sized delegation of local residents and business men are urged to be present.

The Portland delegation is under the leadership of William P. Merry and James Richardson. The party has 26 members.

Care for transporting the visitors to Medford will be donated by the Scheerer Motor company.
