

RAIL EXTENSION PROTEST BY S. P. GIVEN PUBLICITY

'Shippers Committee' Postcard Warns Against Slandorous Statements—Rosenbaum Pleads Company Cause in Statement.

Railroad development in southern Oregon entered the wordy stage today, in no uncertain manner, with the issuance of two statements by the publicity wing of the Southern Pacific.

One, printed on the back of a postcard, issued by the Shippers' Committee, Good Railway Service Association, was entitled: "A Warning Against Slandorous Statements," and reads as follows:

"Patrons: The Shippers' Committee of the Good Railway Service Association respectfully advises you that the news release issued June 5 from the Great Northern and Western Pacific Railways attacking this organization, is untruthful in detail and slandorous in character. So with similar statements made by speakers for the above railroads.

The hundreds of reputable citizens enrolled in this organization have every right to express their well-grounded opposition to costly railroad duplication at public expense, and competition destructive to rail service. It is regrettable that, for speaking their minds, men of standing should be subjected to scurrilous attacks from agents of railroads seeking to stampee public sentiment. The second statement embodied remarks of A. R. Rosenbaum, well-known general agent of the Southern Pacific in Southern Oregon, and is as follows:

"Ninety-five chambers of commerce, industrial organizations, public and quasi-public bodies have passed resolutions protesting the proposed Great Northern-Western Pacific railroad construction in northeastern California, according to word received today by A. R. Rosenbaum, general agent for southern Oregon for the Southern Pacific company.

"Mr. Rosenbaum said the roster of opposing organizations is growing daily as fast as speakers for the Southern Pacific can present the facts behind that railroad's opposition to the building. And it is facts alone that the Southern Pacific can offer," said Mr. Rosenbaum, "facts that appeal to clear-thinking cool-headed business men not susceptible to booster hysteria or influenced by personal bias.

"The Southern Pacific," said Mr. Rosenbaum, "is basing its opposition on the self-evident fact that the proposed construction would amount to a paralleling of existing facilities, a wasteful duplication and an unwarranted invasion of territory, in contravention of the Transportation Act of 1920, which interdicts such practices.

"The building of the road," he said, "was not predicated upon public necessity or convenience nor was there any public demand for it save that artificially created by agents of the two railroads planning it.

"As a local road within the territory, there is not now and will not be for many years to come a sufficient amount of traffic to justify the investment that would be made or afford a reasonable return thereon," said Mr. Rosenbaum. "It simply means adding an unneeded, unreasonably investment burden on the rate-paying public."

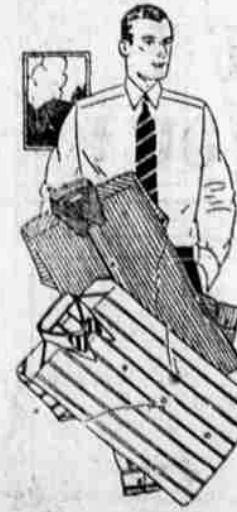
