

THIRD MEMBER SURPLUS WATER HONEYMOON AT CHICAGO FAMILY MAY BE SOLD END LINDBERGH DIES OF POISON WITHOUT FEAR BACK TO WORK

Mysterious Complaint Takes Three Children of Kwiatkowskis—Father and Mother Accuse Each Other of Poison.

CHICAGO, June 19.—(AP) Death by poison or disease—doctors have not determined which—took a third member of the family of five children who were stricken Monday night.

Lorraine Markowski, 3, was the latest victim. Her half-brother, Chester Kwiatkowski, 9, died soon after he was taken to the hospital, and Agnes Kwiatkowski, 8, his sister, died yesterday.

The other children, Richard and Doris Markowski, 6 years and 17 months old, respectively, were still in a critical condition. Meanwhile the children's mother, Mrs. Verma Markowski, and her husband Edwin, showed symptoms of the same ailment. They were placed under medical care in the psychopathic hospital, where they had been taken for observation after being questioned by the police.

The vital organs of the first two victims were removed yesterday for chemical analysis of their contents. Physicians said the children apparently had eaten some deadly poison, but its character was not determined. Some said they believed the family was suffering from a mysterious disease.

Markowski, a paint sprayer by trade, told police that last week he took home a poisonous solution for removing paint from his hands. Preliminary examination of the first two victims' organs showed that this was the poison that caused their deaths, physicians said.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Markowski denied they were responsible for the poisoning, but each accused the other.

"She did it; my wife did it," Markowski insisted.

Mrs. Markowski, hysterical much of the time, cried: "My husband did it."

CITY COUNCIL DIVIDED.

He said that if the city park site was selected it would not ruin the park, as only a part of the rear end of the park would be used, and even if it did a new, larger and better park could be established in some other location.

He then said that the Hollywood orchard property on the Jacksonville road far outside the western city limits, or the Pacific E Eastern railroad tract adjoining the Bear creek bridge could be purchased by the city for use as a park for \$25,000. He told that several of the city administration had some time ago looked over the Hollywood orchard property as a tentative future city park site.

Mayor Pipes also contended that with the court house erected on the park site, that building could become the nucleus of a big civic center. The mayor argued that a court house built in a part of the city park would enhance the remaining park's attractiveness, as the park would then receive better care.

Mr. Kershaw and the other councilmen participating in the debate, except Mr. Wilson, held that they did not care where the court house was built except in the city park.

Citizens Oppose

It seems that the city officials, or at least some of the councilmen, have been hearing from many citizens who oppose the idea of a court house in the city park. Councilman E. M. Wilson said, among other things, that he thought that the erection of a court house in a park would not destroy it as a recreational center for the people.

During the debate several of the councilmen backing up Mr. Kershaw's opposition to the city park site, especially longed to mention the word "home," although for the most part all the speakers but Messrs. Pipes and Kershaw pleaded for a compromise agreement.

In arguing briefly for the preservation of the park, Mr. Collins said that even if the park was sold to a great extent by tourists and other transients, a place was needed for such visitors. "The park is used by many more of the citizens than you'd think," he said. "Of course, some buses and others of that kind use the park."

Mr. McShane held that it would be foolish to destroy the city park for a court house, and Messrs. Finckel and Wing, while opposing in general the city park site, held that the question of submitting it as one of the proposed sites should be left to the people of Medford.

Suggest Compromise

Various compromises were suggested, even to submitting the question to a vote, but those who favored this for a time declared that only the people of Medford should have the say, and the rest of the county should not be allowed to vote on the site question.

It was also stated in the debate that the school board of Medford wanted the Washington school site to be withdrawn from the list of available sites, as the board would not be ready to build a new high school building and sell the Washington school building, for at least 100 years.

No Danger of Depleting Medford's Supply By Sale to Outside Districts, Declares Chairman of Water Commission—Good Business for Taxpayers.

At the regular Monday night meeting of the city water commission there was a general discussion of the opinion just given by the city attorney as to the sale of surplus water to outside districts of the city, and it was generally agreed that there was no serious obstacle to prevent a solution being arrived at between the city council and water commission.

E. C. Gaddis, chairman, summarized the action of the meeting as follows:

"Since the commission has full authority within the city, it appears to be logical that they could be given like authority by the council or by vote of the people to sell surplus water to outside districts."

"Those who are familiar with the original act creating the board of water commissioners have understood that they were to be given full authority over the water system, both inside and outside the city limits, and it appears that through failure to repeal a part of one section of the city charter this authority was not conveyed to the water commission as intended."

"The commissioners are unanimous in their conclusion that a part of the surplus city water be sold to outside districts for domestic use. Two years careful checkup of Medford's average daily use of water enables us to know the actual amount required, therefore, there is no guess work nor snap judgment on this important matter. Four million gallons average daily use for 1928 and eight million gallons average daily waste for same period. Let us assume that we might double the average daily use per year within the next fifteen years; should that occur, the city would then consume an average daily amount of eight million gallons for the year 1944 but would still be wasting an average of four million gallons of water per day throughout the year, which would still represent an enormous waste. Why isn't it good business to build up outside sale to approximately one-half million gallons of water per day if possible and save a small part of the loss now suffered continuously?"

"Total water bonds outstanding the first of the year was \$1,231,000 and payments are planned and scheduled to retire them within 28 years. Revenue of \$1000 per month received from outside water users during these 28 years would pay \$336,000 of these bonds, or almost one-third of them. What better opportunity could present itself to the city to cash in on its surplus water and distribute the bond burden to a much larger number of citizens?"

Portland alone is spending from \$50,000 to \$60,000 a year in carrying on this work.

Mr. Allen, for a long time past has sounded the warning for local people to be on the lookout for the first presence of earwigs, or any suspicious insects, and bring specimens to himself or the county agent for examination.

This warning has not been heeded and Mr. Allen and city and county officials again urge any one who finds a suspicious looking unknown kind of insect to bring it to the county agent's office for examination.

The earwig looks like a consumptive cockroach, being much thinner and possibly longer.

Sediment in a water bottle can be removed by partly filling it with soapy water and placing it in some shot or dry rice and then shaking it around until the sediment is dislodged.

Coming to Pacific Coast On Tour of Air Transport Line—Ties Up Yacht After 1000 Mile Cruise Up East Coast.

NEW YORK, June 19.—(AP)—His honeymoon at an end, Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh was back at work today.

His first professional engagement since his marriage to Anne Spencer Morrow, May 27, was at Mitchell field to observe in the final flight tests for the \$150,000 prizes offered for the safest aircraft by the Daniel Guggenheim fund for the promotion of aeronautics. He was invited to witness the tests as trustee and advisor to the fund organization.

Colonel Lindbergh and his bride brought their honeymoon trip to a close yesterday when the famous flyer tied his motor cruiser, Monticello, to a dock at Sands Point, Long Island.

Mr. and Mrs. Lindbergh were guests yesterday afternoon on the Daniel Guggenheim estate, and after luncheon left in a closed car in the direction of New York.

After observing the safety tests, Colonel Lindbergh is expected to make a three weeks' tour of the Transcontinental Air Transport line, which will take him to the Pacific coast. He is technical advisor for the line.

His motor yacht was piloted back to its berth at Bayonne, N. J., by Irwin Chase, manager of the company that built it. After inspecting the craft, Mr. Chase praised Colonel Lindbergh's seamanship and skill as a small boat pilot.

"I told Colonel Lindbergh," he said, "that even an experienced yachtsman would be proud of the feat he had performed. To make a 1,000-mile trip up the coast without a crew or navigator, and without any previous experience, is noteworthy. Colonel Lindbergh told me he had not encountered the slightest trouble during the long trip."

Colonel Lindbergh's plane, which has been at Scheunetady, N. Y., since it was flown there the day after his marriage, was taken back to Curtiss field yesterday. While there, visitors at the field had decorated it with "newly married" placards, in expectation that it would be used for his honeymoon.
